## External Violence May Injure Eyes

By Gertrude E. Taylor

Inflammation of the eye membrane and lids may be of a catarrhal form, or it may be the result of external violence, the presence of irritating foreign matter, exposure to dampness and cold, a sign of distemper or worms.

Keep the cat or kit away from strong light, cold, drafts and other irritants. The lids should be opened and a drop of sweet oil dropped into the eye. Use clean absorbent cotton and gently wipe the eye. This will get any foreign matter if that is the cause of the inflammation. Use warm boracic acid solution on clean absorbent cotton, holding it for a minute or two to the eye. (Some people advise adding three tablespoonfuls of witch-hazel to a tumbler of boracic acid solution.)

#### Oxide of Zinc

If the eye becomes opaque, try the application of dry oxide of zinc after first bathing the eye with warm milk and water. If the kit or cat acts as if the eyes pain, a drop of five per cent solution of cocaine will give relief.

Sometimes a too pungent disinfectant will cause eye trouble. Conjunctivitis often occurs in young kittens from exposure to cold or too strong a light. The lids become glued together from the discharge. This should be gently removed, and the lids separated with a warm swab of clean absorbent cotton dipped in warm sweet oil. Never allow the eyes to remain glued shut for any length of time, else the discharge will work on the eye causing blindness. Never use anything cold when treating eyes.

"It leaves a clean skin, a large and muscular body, fat enough to make the coat stand out loose from the body, with sparkle and gloss and never a mat. The professor never gives cod liver oil on anything. A perfect ration takes care of the lime and all requirements a growing kit needs.

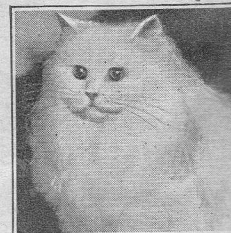

14 and 15 pounds each, and are not very fat either. They are never mated or out of coat and \$500 wouldn't tempt the professor to sell them.

"He feeds one quarter-pound lean ground meat, one tablespoonful of spinach or tomatoes, one tablespoonful of carrots. Sometimes he adds a bit of tuna or salmon to each cat's feeding once a day. Each morning he gives raw milk with one egg yolk and a teaspoonful of orange juice. This covers a period of two years. They have never been off their food, they are regular, eyes sparkle, and they romp like six-week old kittens; they look like dogs. They are positively sensational with ruffles and frills, and carry full plumes.

### CATS FOR DEFENSE

Complete with identification tag, bearing her paw-print, time-clock number and name, Emma, a cat, went to work recently at a war plant in Chicago, and released a man for war work.

It had been the custom for a man employe to make the rounds, setting mouse traps, until Emma was assigned the task and issued her tag. Her job is to catch the mice.

### ZOO ABUNDANCE REPLACES LOSS
