## The Cat in America

By ISABELLA COLE

(Continued from the February Issue)

Africa's high jumper, the serval, *Felis serval*, who is exceptionally light in bone, with long legs and a rather short tail may be the wild ancestor of the domestic Abyssinian. The large, erect, rounded ears of both varieties is very noticeable. Though the servals tail is short it could not be called a bobtail. The rear legs are the same length as the fore legs. The spots of the serval could have been blended with one of solid color to give the flecking of the Abyssinian.

The standard of the Abyssinian lays the greatest emphasis upon color, which Weir states was produced among English domestic short haired cats by crossing ticked and herring striped tabbies with solid color cats, such as whites, blues and blacks. Personally, I have found this to be true of colors with both English bull dogs and Kung cats. I believe the cat fancy lays too great stress on color at the sacrifice of conformation. Structure is much more slowly acquired and similarly lost. I have not had an opportunity to breed Abyssinian cats so do not know first hand about the dominant and recessive characteristics. Very few specimens have been exhibited in the eastern shows, but in general it appears to be a type leaning toward a wedge shaped head. Its very long ears are in harmony with this type of head, but they are distinctly blunt at the tips, while the *Felis chaus* type is pointed. The Cat Fanciers' Association standard calls for "a sharp ear". No mention is made of longer rear legs, roached back or slanting eyes. It does state in the standard that the cat must be long in body. No mention of an impish disposition is given. So combining these requirements it does not appear that the Abyssinian could come from the *Felis chaus*; therefore, the serval

ancestry seems most plausible. I would be very glad to work with "off typed" specimens of this breed, providing any fancier cares to co-operate.

*Felis chaus* is mentioned by Darwin as being one of the three types of cats found among Egyptian mummies. This cat was well-known in Persia, Mesopotamia and Palestine. H. B. Tristram, M. A. Oxon.; L. L. D.; F. R. S. in "Natural History of the Bible," London, 1868, gives a picture on page 67 of *Felis chaus*. He mentions the domestic cats of Palestine as being similar to those of England and the most common wild cat as the *Felis chaus*, a "booted cat," with a short bushy tail, black feet and tufts of hair at the extremity of its ears. He adds: "It is a small lynx rather than a cat." Darwin states that the *Felis chaus* has a thick, lynx like tail and a broad bar on the inside of the forearm. Sir W. Elliot states he has often observed this same mark on the forearms of domestic cats in India, but that such a coloration is utterly unknown in European cats. Whereas the "proper" tabby markings (pale streaks on a black ground), peculiarly and symmetrically disposed, so common in English cats, are never seen in those of India. (See Natural Geographical Magazine, Volume 74, Number 5, November, 1938, for markings on Indian common cats, page 617. Also page 592, *ibid*, for common cat patterns in Rome). Darwin also states that the common cat of India appears to have been derived from four different wild species, but he does not state the four wild types.

Dr. Glover M. Allen in "Mammals of Mongolia," 2 volumes, 1938, divides the small group cats into two types:

1. Small cat, tiger typed, tail length of body and similar to *Felis Sylvestris* and *Felis libyca*.

2. Short tailed, lynx type, cat *Felis chaus* and its allies—of which one race seems to extend to western borders of China. George Mivert in *The Cat*, 1881, mentions numerous smaller typed cats with bobtails that inhabit the Malayan peninsula and the East Indies. His details are scanty and his information appears to have been taken from the measurements of skins deposited in the British Museum rather than from first hand information, like the more recent authors. From these researches it may be concluded that two types of domestic cat, based upon structural differences, are recognized today, the tiger type and the lynx type.

Would it not be more scientific to classify the breeds accepted by the cat fancy into these two types, rather than divide them by color and length of fur? A mixed or hybrid type would be given an intermediate class. The tiger type would include all cats with round heads, domed foreheads, small ears, short nose and foreface, eyes round and not slanting to the nose, body long and slender, back straight, and belly line straight with no roach or elevation of rear quarters, tail the length of body, legs of the same length. Fur can be short or long and any color.

Lynx type would include wedge shaped heads, flat foreheads with no nose stop, or dent, a long nose and a very strong jaw, very long pointed ears set high on upper corners of triangle and held upright, eyes slanting 45 degrees toward the nose, whiskers turned downward and eyebrows curved forward and abundant, body short, compact and very hard and muscular with heavy bone, body much heavier at hips like kangaroo

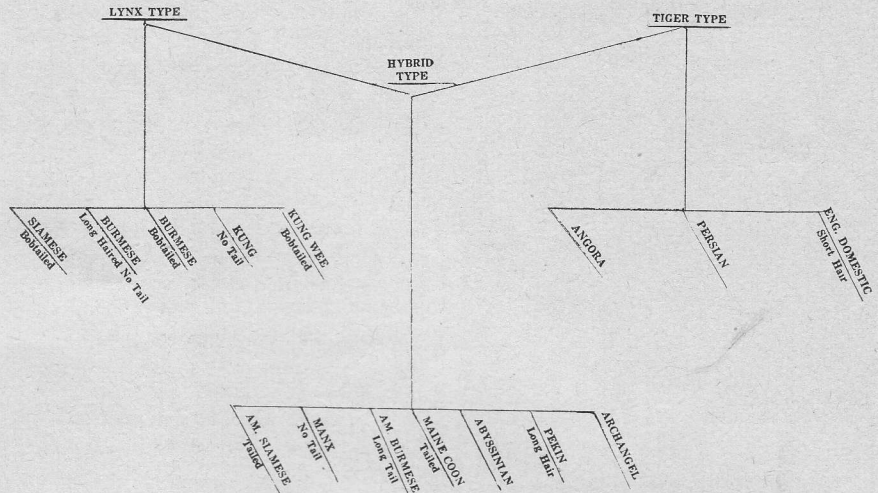

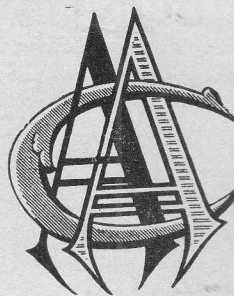

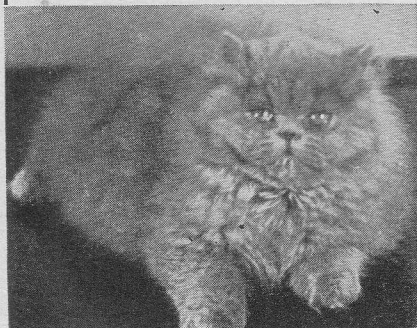

**Ear Mites**

Ear mites cannot be seen with the naked eye, and when a dark brown substance forms in the ear they are there, so get busy by pouring a tiny bit of olive oil—just barely warm—into the ear; let it stand for part of a day, then take cotton on your finger and get out all you can. Put a pinch of dry boracic acid powder down in the ear. Do this each day, until they stay clean without it. If in bad shape, it sometimes takes three weeks to clear up, but they can work down into the brain and cause death to your cat, or perhaps a bad abscess.

If your cat is not easily handled to do this, pin it up-right in a large bath towel.

If baby kits are handled a lot, place your fingers in the ears each day, "fuss around" them, and they won't mind it so much if they have to be treated later on.

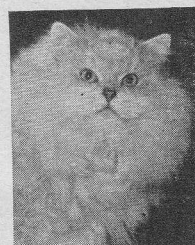

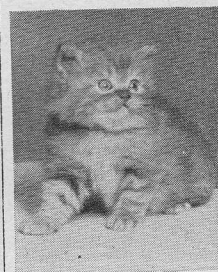

**Feeding the Kitten**

By VINCENT M. COUCH

When the cat has reached the age of about 18 months, it will do nicely on considerably less food as it is then strong and vigorous. If kept on a farm or in a suburb or country town, it will make much of its own living. However, what is given should be wholesome, palatable, such as will help the natural diet. Cats kept in close confinement and with little chance for exercise, require more careful feeding.

Keep in mind that the milk of the cat is much richer and sweeter than cows' milk when caring for a kitten that is being weaned. Goats' milk for growing kittens or any other small animals is much better. The globules of goats' milk is very small and much more easily digested than cows' milk. The stomach of the kitten is so small it cannot hold much food at a time and being quite sensitive, it may be

easily upset. A teaspoonful of rich milk or thin cream is excellent for a kitten and about five drops of lime water added three times a week is helpful. At noon give a small piece of raw beef, not larger than a small marble, and about three times a week give a bone with very little meat on it to aid in making healthy and strong teeth. For the evening meal a little more meat and milk may be given, or a little whole wheat bread and milk may be substituted for meat for the evening feed. As the kitten grows, a little more meat may be fed and light feed of raw liver once or twice a week is fine. All the food that is kept in a refrigerator for the kitten should be taken out before feeding and warmed.

When kept for pets, the female may be spayed when three or four months old and the male castrated when partly grown. Some claim that after such operations, cats have less vitality and resistance to disease. This may be true in some cases, but not in my experience. I have had several which were operated on and all lived beyond the normal age for cats, one reaching the age of 19 years with never a day of sickness.

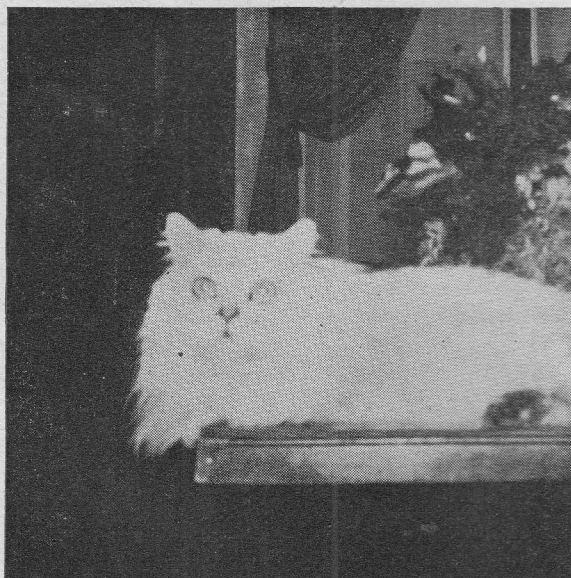

## REMEDY FOR CHOKING

There is nothing which will throw a  
cat owner into a minor panic as much  
as choking on the part of the cat. This  
generally shows that something has  
lodged in the pet's throat, though in  
some cases, an abnormal growth in  
the throat is the cause.

Cats do not choke because they  
gulp down big hulks of food like a  
dog does, but rather, because they  
playfully swallow a button, needle,  
thread or some other such object, all  
in a spirit of fun. Strange as it may  
seem, swallowing needles is not rare,  
and every now and then papers carry  
accounts of a cat getting a needle  
down its throat—or part way down.

Needles are probably the most dan-  
gerous of objects to a cat. Cat lovers  
should always be careful that the  
needle is put where cats can't reach  
them. Never allow a needle to lay on  
the floor after dropping it. When the  
cat swallows a needle, it cannot spit  
it out like most other animals, because  
of the peculiar construction of the  
tongue.

Unfortunately, one cannot detect  
the condition of choking at once. The  
cat may swallow and strain a bit,  
and it may go on unnoticed. When  
the stage becomes acute, there isn't  
much doubt of what is happening.

The pet owner himself is usually  
helpless in acute cases. The thing to  
do is to see the veterinarian at once.  
Attempting to relieve the cat of the  
object may do it more harm than  
good. As long as the needle or other

object is lodged in the throat, the chances of saving the pet are fair, but once it gets down into the intestine, the pet may die.

Dogs can stand such shocks much better than cats. Many a dog swallows a button or other object which will not cause the slightest discomfort. The same thing working through a cat's tract will kill it. The interior make-up of the cat is quite delicate, and the nervous system cannot stand the shock.

Objects are removed right through the mouth, or in some cases, through an operation. The latter usually is successful.

Feeding bones to a cat encourages the trouble of choking. One should know better than to feed a bone to a cat as it is a pretty dainty animal. A bone, particularly a fish or chicken bone, is dangerous.

Once in a while, hairballs cause choking, and cases of this have been recorded.

It's quite possible to get your cat used to a certain food, with the result he will not care for anything else. Once a wrong habit is established, it's hard to break. If you have a little of the iron heart in you, try starving it into eating the right food. It may hurt kitty's feeling and appetite a bit, but then again, it will be best in the long run.

A kitten, after weaning and up to three months, should be fed four times a day. The nightcap winds up the usual three meals. When the cat grows, the last may be omitted.
