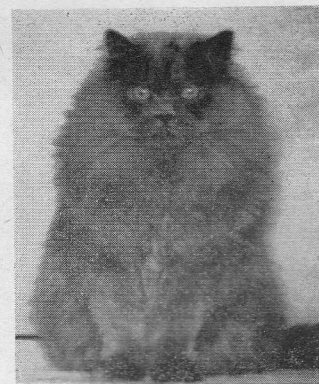

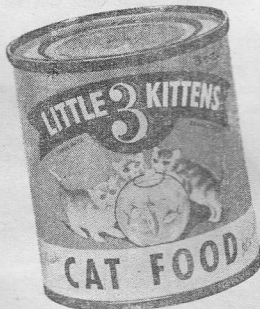

There is room for one other topic only this month, and we wish to use

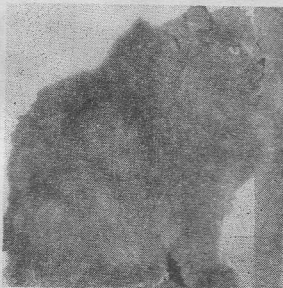

Caution in Breeding

Smokes are best mated to their own color, instead of outcrossing with another color. Because Blacks have orange eyes and Silvers green eyes, it is not advisable to interbreed the two colors. Besides getting a varied color mixture of coats, you will have the same difficulty in eye colors which are not acceptable on the show bench, and thus the cats become unwanted as breeders of quality stock.

Difficulties in breeding Tortoiseshells arise because there are no Tortie males to use for stud, thus necessitating the use of Red, Black, White or Cream.
