All the funds that are received from the sale of National Cat Week seals are used for the purchase of literature and posters.

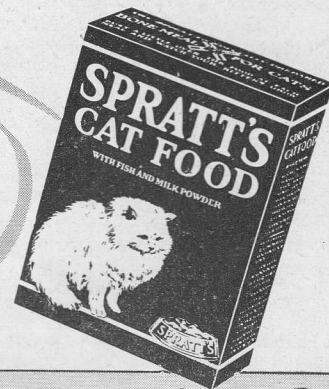

NEW KITTEN IN YOUR HOME

This is the time of year when kittens are getting large enough to leave home and mother and go to their new abodes. Whether it be a cute alley kitten or a highly bred show type the reactions to new places are the same. First is the wide-eyed fear of the new and strange, then the cautious, tip-toeing around the house to investigate everything from cellar to attic and finally the settling down to take over the complete running of the household—such as deciding upon whose bed to sleep, which "best" chair to reserve for himself and the exact time his meals must be served. When this third and last phase has been reached, the new mistress is on her own against the kitten's slave driving, but the first and second phases do warrant special consideration.

Of course, all kittens sense immediately if a person is a real cat lover and so the cat *fanatic* of the household should be the first to welcome and pet and cuddle the new kitten. Don't, however, smother him with love at first, but do let him know he is truly welcome. If the kitten has been expressed to his new home in a carrier, this is usually regarded by the kitten as the only connecting link to his past happiness and when he tires of petting let him hide in the carrier. Show the new kitten his sand box and water dish and leave him alone to relax and investigate a small room such as a service porch or bath room. Do not let the children bring all the neighbor kids right over to see the new pet, and be especially careful not to introduce him to the old, crochety family cat or the dog right away. Don't worry if the kit does not eat for a day or two. Nobody feels like eating when he is suffering from homesickness. When the kitten does show an interest in food, as he will soon, feed him the same diet he has been used to in his former home. If you feel that the diet should be changed, begin by feeding small portions of the new food along with his regular prescribed meal. Soon your preferred diet can take the place of, or be interchanged with the old. Make sure, if possible, if the kitten has been used to milk. If not, it is a mistake to expect him to handle it. In some cases milk causes upset bowels and even diarrhea.

Now that we have your new kitten settled and eating, the next phase is the real investigating procedure. That kitten has to know every inch of the house and

each separate smell that means so much to him. This sometimes gets him into a lot of trouble and causes his new owner anxious moments. When the kit is first turned loose in the house it is well to watch him carefully, for there are several things that he is quite likely to do. One of the most common is for an uninitiated kitten to mistake a stove for a table and hop onto it. If the stove is hot he will do it only once, but burns to his little toe pads are very painful and easily become infected. He will, no doubt, crawl under the refrigerator and scare the daylights out of you for fear he will get his tail caught in the works. So far, we have never had a kitten hurt in this way, but it is a hazard. Be sure that there are no splintery chicken bones left around that he can chew; these and fish bones can be deadly if they have a chance to puncture the intestine. Once, years ago, a new kitten at our house jumped upon the sink and licked the drain where some powdered soap had remained and he was a very sick kitty, indeed. I'm not writing this to endeavor to frighten a potential kitten owner, but am trying to point out that with a little forethought on your part a kitten can be spared a lot of pain or sickness.

In the first paragraph I mentioned that a kitten will investigate everything from cellar to attic and he will too! If you have no cellar he will get under the house

A Short History of THE BOSTON CAT CLUB

In the Winter of 1904, Mrs. Helen Brayton had an idea. It continued to grow as the wintry weeks dissolved into Spring, and then she acted. She contacted five of her friends who were cat-minded like herself and on a specified date convened at the Animal Rescue League Headquarters in Boston. As a result the Boston Cat Club was founded, to become one of the outstanding feline groups today.

With Mrs. Brayton taking the lead in the activity, which reflects in the very strong and stable foundation of the Club today, a Cat Show was planned and successfully presented for the first time in 1905 at Mechanics Hall, in conjunction with the Poultry Show. The event was spectacular in that it attracted 185 cats and extended over a period of five days. The show was staged under the rules of the American Cat Association. It was not until 1911 that the schedule was reduced to three days.

In 1909, the Boston show attracted many unusual entries, and, according to the catalog, one Siamese, two Abyssinians, five Manx, six Australians and several Russian cats competed in the event. The Australian and Russian entries were owned by Miss Alfreda Richards of New Bedford, Mass., and presumably caused quite a sensation.

By 1914 the Boston Cat Show was attracting exhibitors with their cats from all sections of the United States. The catalog that year showed a record field of 214 entries, with no less than 19 pages devoted to the listing of "specials," from a box of chocolates to \$2.50 in gold!

It was with the 1919 show that Boston decided to stage its first independent exhibition. The fashionable Copley Plaza Hotel was engaged and the show staged for the T.B. Children of Devastated France. Funds in the amount of \$900 were presented to this cause. The following year and until 1934, the shows were held under C.F.F. rules.

Beginning with the exhibition in 1922, most of the Boston Cat Club shows have been staged at Horticultural Hall. Mrs. Gertrude Taylor of Detroit was the Judge of the 1922 event, and the records show that the silver classes carried off the majority of "bests." Better than \$950 was cleared to form an attractive treasury for later activity. The sales table that year featured 170 pots of growing oats and 200 catnip mice, presented by the club members. After the show, Mrs. Taylor remarked that "in all her years of judging, she had never officiated at such a well conducted show."

It was following the 1922 show that Mrs. Helen Brayton, the Club Delegate to

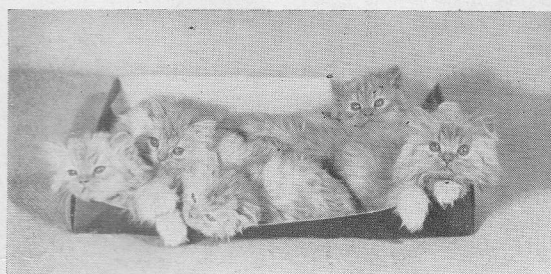
the Annual CFF meeting, made the motion that a Championship Class be allowed. This was apparently approved because the following year, such a class appeared in the catalog, although only two cats were entered.

The Boston Cat Club was now growing in membership and the records of 1923 reveal that there were 101 members and a treasury fund of \$1,000. Special sales

were held prior to the scheduled shows to aid in the expenses of the exhibitions. These informal events realized about \$100.

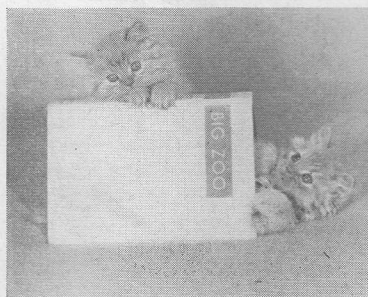
In 1925 Boston Cat Club reached new heights. The January show that year revealed that the sale of tickets by members totaled \$473; a kitten raffle earned \$240; and the sales table returned \$125. During all these years, bundle parties, "snipping" parties, birthday parties and other events were staged to swell the treasury. At the

meetings which were well attended, a mite box or "the dark horse" was on "display" for the members' pennies, nickles and dimes. It is still in use today.

The 1926 show was a "double" and was staged under the rulings of the C.F.F. and the A.C.A. The Club resigned its membership with the former group in 1926 and remained unaffiliated for eight years.

A Silver Specialty show was held in conjunction with the 1931 exhibition and resulted in an entry of 57 cats. The founder of the Club, now Mrs. Helen Brayton Tate, was the judge and Miss Lillian M. Goodwin, present C.F.A. secretary, won the "Best" award with her cat, Ch. Dreamland Raschid. The following year, the show staged a Siamese Specialty and in this event, Best Cat went to Newton's Salome, owned by Mrs. Hugh Dailey.

In 1934 The Boston Cat Club affiliated with the Cat Fanciers Association.

The club featured an unusual attraction in 1937, the first event of its kind in the United States. This was a Championship Mouse Show, resulting in 50 exhibits, each benched in its own tiny cage.

Ever since 1928, the Club employed Mr. Rupert Kobza as the Secretary for the Annual Shows, however, in 1940 the members voted to handle this difficult position themselves. The profits from the 1940

event were donated to the British War Relief. This amounted to \$700. During the years of the War, all profits were turned over to War Relief—in 1941, the Red Cross; and in 1942, the Army and Navy Emergency Relief.

The Boston Stage Door Canteen received a check for \$500 after the 1944 show. In 1945, \$200 was presented to the March of Dimes; \$100 to the Stage Door Canteen, and other funds to the Angell Memorial Hospital, and the Animal Rescue League. In addition a wheel chair and walker were sent to the Soldiers Home at Chelsea, Mass.

Through all the years, regular meetings have been held in hotels, tea rooms and the homes of members. Many fine programs have been presented, with members or outside speakers engaged. Cats have been exhibited at meetings and judged; articles on the feeding and care of cats and kittens read, discussions on catteries, preparing cats for shows, other subjects.

During the last few years a Year Book has been issued. This is distributed to members in January and contains the places of meetings and the programs for the entire year.

Boston has started many "firsts," including the use of oil cloth on the floors of the judging cages in order that the cages be better cleaned between classes. The Club was first to make use of the "Breeders' Directory" in the show catalog, and first to have a Cat Show "In Memoriam" to a cat. This was the 1943 Siamese Specialty event and the cat was Dbl. Ch. DjerKits Chinkaling of Newton. The show was made possible financially, by donations from Chinky's friends, the sum of \$125 being raised. Mrs. Pauline Kelsey was the Judge and donated her services.

It is believed that Boston is the only club that exhibits its Cups and Trophies during its annual show.

The latest action by the Club was the presenting of a tiger to the Franklin Park Zoo in Boston, from funds obtained at the 1947 event.

There have been many famous cats entered in Boston shows, including "Hindy" the Boston Post Cat; "Eleanor Bolling" who flew to the South Pole with Admiral Byrd on his first expedition; "Frisky" the Hairless cat; "Tommy Atkins" the cat who was nailed in with a crated shell for Harvard University (by mistake of course). In reference to "Tommy Atkins," this cat remained in the crate for three weeks and was practically dead when the huge box was opened. "Cougat," an ocelot, brought to the United States by a returning G. I., was exhibited at the 1946 show.

Members of the club credit much of the success of the annual show to the generous help provided by the Boston newspapers, which completely "cover" the show pictorially weeks in advance and throughout the scheduled event.

Oldest members of Boston Cat Club in terms of years as associated with the club are Mrs. Annie Greely, Mrs. Marguerite Saxby-Mabie, Mrs. Mabel A. Lafayette, Mrs. Emma Raymond, Mrs. C. M. Crossley, Mrs. J. Barnard Buzzell, Miss Mary Cass, Miss Irma Rich, Mrs. Virginia Cobb, and Miss Beatrice Pray.

Since 1918, Charity has realized nearly \$7,500 from the Boston Cat Show, a truly remarkable presentation and one of which every member should feel justly proud.
