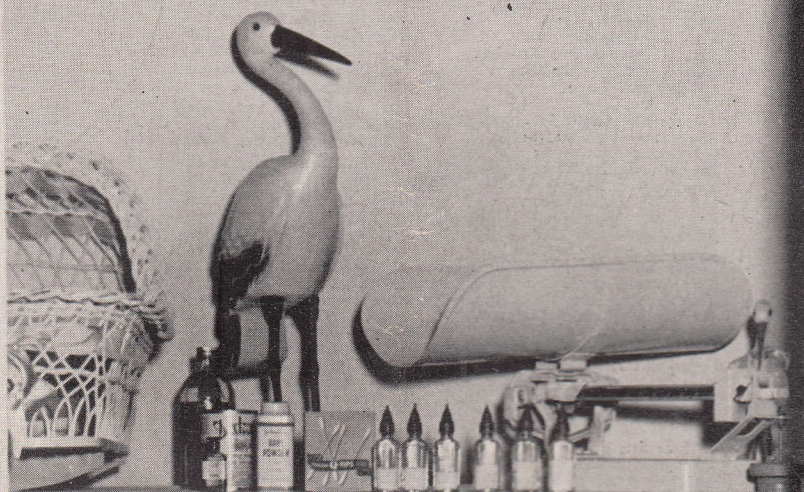

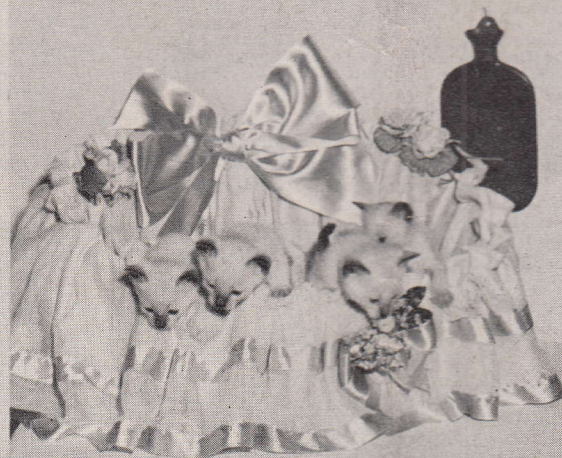

GR. CH. LAVENDER LIBERTY BEAU IS 1950 CAT OF THE YEAR

California, with sixteen listings, literally ran away with the Fourth Annual and 1950 All American Cat Rankings. Forty-five aristocrats of the show world have been selected as the top ranking cats of the United States and Canada on the basis of competition furnished by officially sanctioned cat shows and determined by a mathematical system applied to the results of these exhibitions.

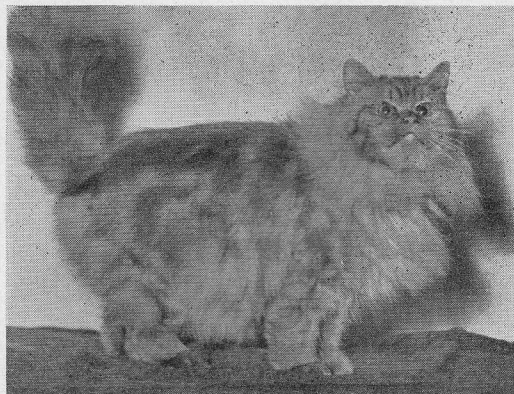
Grand Champion Lavender Liberty Beau, a Blue Longhair male, owned by Anthony De Santis of Oakland, N. J., has won the coveted title of 1950 All-American Cat of the Year. The new titleholder was bred by Ed. Wiest, to mark the first time that an Eastern owner has captured the title. Lavender Liberty Beau succeeds Grand Champion Dixi-Land's Felice of Nor-Mont, a Blue female, owned by Mrs. Merald E. Hoag of Arlington, Va.

Hollywood, Calif., won the crown. In 1948 it was the male, Grand Champion Pearl Harbor Yank, owned by Mrs. J. H. Revington of Bristol, Tenn., and last year Felice ascended the throne.

The New Jersey Cat of the Year won Nine Bests in Show during the 1949-50 Season and was far in front of his nearest competitor on points.

Best Opposite Sex Cat of the Year as well as second high point scoring cat is Grand Champion Vee Roi's Lantara Gene, Siamese Blue Point female, a three-time All-America winner, owned by Mrs. R. H. Hecht of Normandy, Missouri. The winner takes over the 1950 throne, succeeding Champion Dixi-Land's White Historian II, an Orange-eye White long-hair, owned by Mrs. J. H. Revington. Lantara Gene, who is the first Grand Champion Siamese in the history of the American cat fancy, won Best Opposite Sex Cat of the Year in 1947, thus setting a new record.

A new record was achieved in the All-American rankings, when Double Champion Aztec's Belinda, a Silver Tabby female Short Hair, owned by Mrs. F. W. Freudenthal of Darien, Conn., scored her fourth consecutive All America title, the only cat to accomplish this feat since the Rankings were originated in 1947.

Seventeen states and a province of Canada are represented in the 1950 Rankings. California's landslide total of sixteen places is followed by Virginia with four in the runnerup position. Illinois, Maryland and Ohio, each scored with three. New Jersey, Michigan and Massachusetts lists two each; and the following came through with single representatives: Tennessee, Minnesota, Florida, Georgia, Wisconsin, Pennsylvania, Missouri, New York, Connecticut and Ontario, Canada.

The West with California's Big Sixteen carried off Sectional honors, with the Midwest accounting for eleven; the

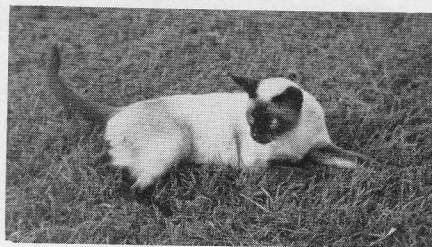

South ten, and the East with eight spots.

In no one class did All-America winners find the going easy. The majority of places were well-earned, particularly in the Siamese positions where a fraction of a point determined one of the titles.

The 1950 All American Cat Selections are not the personal choices of Cats Magazine. Total points determine the winners. There could be many cats who would quite possibly be selected All-American for 1950, but their owners failed to show them sufficiently to acquire the points. Fifty points and a Sectional listing are needed by an entry to qualify for All-American. Twenty-five points are necessary for an entry to qualify for All-Sectional (East, Midwest, South and West).

The quest for 1951 All-America honors are already underway. The campaign for 1950-51 has started. It should be the biggest ever, as illustrated by the unusual large amount of show advertising published in this issue.

If you believe that you, as an owner of an exceptionally fine cat, have a better cat than the one listed in the 1950 parade, it is suggested that you prove it to yourself and others by entering your cat in the biggest and best shows that are scheduled. Remember that competition is the first pre-requisite for a title. You cannot hope to win by showing your cats in exhibitions where you have the only entry listed in a class.

The exhibitions scheduled this year afford you an opportunity to capture a title for 1951.

Congratulations to the owners of the 1950 All-American Cats! May these Great Cats have a Long and Successful Reign!

To those of you who may be disappointed by failure of your Cat to earn a title, may we simply say, "Better Luck This Year! We hope you are represented this time next Year!

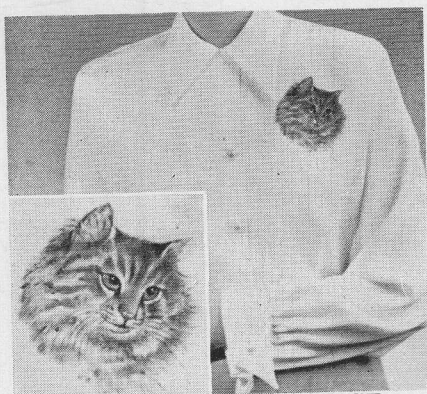

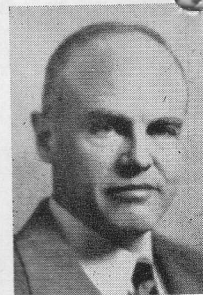

"Cats of Destiny"

CALVIN CAREER CAT

"Is this the residence of Harriet Beecher Stowe, author of *Uncle Tom's Cabin*?"

Often that question was asked by people making pilgrimages to the home of the lady who had written the great anti-slavery novel. But this time it was a large cat which stood at the front door with a quizzical look that put the self-same query. As if he had been assured he had come to the right address, he walked in and settled down.

Kind Mrs. Stowe welcomed her guest, obviously a cat of distinction. He was more or less Maltese, exquisitely proportioned and graceful as a young leopard. From his throat to the tips of his feet his fur was white as ermine. The expression on his handsome, whiskered countenance was alert and wise.

The cat's stay might have been permanent, but soon Mrs. Stowe decided to

move from New England to Florida. Since she could not take the cat, she gave him to another writer, Charles Dudley Warner. The big Maltese found an ideal home and a fond master whose pen would make him one of the most famous of cats.

His gravity won him the name of Calvin after the Protestant reformer, and so dignified was his presence that he was never familiarly called John. Yet sometimes he would relax to play with a ball of yarn or chase his tail with hilarity.

Calvin was one of the smartest of cats. He would stand on his hind legs and open all doors which had old-fashioned latches. If a room were too cool to suit him, he would turn on the hot-air register. "He could do almost everything but speak," avowed his master, "and you would declare sometimes that you could see a pathetic longing to do that in his intelligent face." To mere mewing Calvin would not condescend, but by mighty and musical purring he expressed his contentment.

No eating in the kitchen for Calvin; he insisted on meals in the dining room where he displayed refined manners. When a fork with a morsel of food was reached down to him on the floor, he would put up a paw and draw it politely to his mouth. Always aware of the contents of the larder, he would refuse beef if there was turkey in the house and decline turkey if oysters were forthcoming.

He rid the house of rats as a duty, though he did not enjoy it. Mice amused him, but he considered them too small game to be taken seriously. He stalked birds in the garden, mostly those robbing the cherry trees, but he never killed, as some sportsmen do, for the sake of killing, but only to satisfy his appetite. In Calvin's justification may be quoted a pointed bit of verse, "The Three Menus":

"She: The cat has eaten our pet bird;

He:—The wicked beast shall die.
Then he resumed his quail on toast

And she ate pigeon pie."

With other cats Calvin did not care to associate. When he heard their nighttime concerts in the shrubbery, he asked to be let out. A rush and a pestzt, and the caterwauling was suddenly quelled. Unruffled, Calvin would quietly return to his seat by the hearth.

Between the Maltese and Warner grew up a close and devoted friendship. The reserved Calvin did not care to be petted but chose to show his own affection

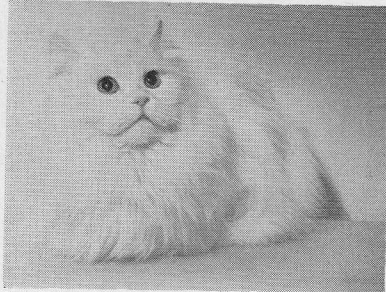

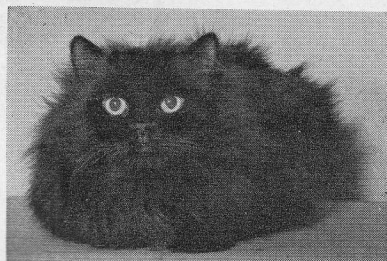

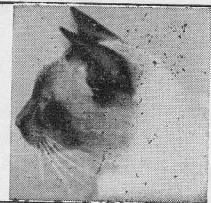

More than 30,000 mobbed the humble dwelling of the owners the first two weeks.

The owners were offered fabulous prices for Angelina, which they turned down. With legal guidance they signed

ALL-AMERICA B. P. SIAMESE RETURNS HOME TO RECEIVE HIS AWARD



CH. BAMBEYLING OF VANAR (AA-50)

Everybody in Rockville, Maryland and the surrounding area knows Champion Bambeyling of Vanar, the 1950 All-American Blue Point Siamese. He was, during the period between June 23 and July 16, perhaps the most advertised cat on record.

All of this because Bambey decided to "Roam in the Gloaming" of the Maryland countryside and throw Mr. and Mrs. L. S. Van Riper, his owners, in a near panic that increased every day until July 16, when he was finally found on the front end of a cat and dog chase.

It was one of those warm, restless June evenings that Bambey set out on his trip. But let Mrs. Van Riper tell it.

"The evening before, we had played a trick on him, and we gleefully laughed and laughed at him. Then we remembered that cats resent being laughed at, but love to be in on a joke. The fact that Bambeyling never is in harmony with his litter brother, Kamal Azad, added another reason for his leaving home."

The Van Ripers began a frantic search and advertising campaign, starting with displays in the "Lost and Found" columns of the district newspapers, pictures and descriptions of the famed show cat on "community bulletin boards" in drug stores and municipal buildings and similar public gathering places.

But the days dragged into weeks, and nothing was heard concerning Bambeyling.

"On July 8, a Saturday," Mrs. Van Riper writes, "the announcement that Champion Bambeyling of Vanar had been awarded All-American 1950 arrived. We know that Cats Magazine never expected an All-American announcement to bring such grief and heaviness of heart. It was quite some time before we could muster up enough ap-

preciation to write that we were glad we had won the title, even if we never found him.

"More advertising; more canvassing; more plans to make pictures and mimeographed descriptions to leave at every door. The worst moments were those while attending the Fall Church Fair show without our Bambeyling to compete. Our hearts ached and we really never wanted to see another show, although we helped others to bench their cats and display their ribbons.

"Then on a Sunday afternoon, 11-year old Patsy Crider, who lives on the other side of town called us. She described the cat that she saw, and was certain that the cat was Bambeyling. It looked like the picture displayed in the drug store community bulletin board. She told us she tried to catch the cat the previous week before she had gone to camp. The cat seemed to stay in a wooded lot near her home, she said, but was too wary to be caught. She had called us after church.

"We departed immediately for her home on Highland Avenue in the northeast section of Rockville, eight blocks from our house.

"We scoured the area and had just about given up hope when Patsy cried out, 'There he goes now! The black dog is chasing him!' Sure enough, there crouched and darted our Bambeyling, acting and looking like a hunted and wary fox. He was streaking for cover in the woods, barely ten feet away.

"Then he recognized us, but was still too cautious to trust the strangers about, or even us. With some maneuvering we cornered him. Then it occurred to us that he was scrambling for food we held. We fed him at once. He was ravenous and very thin.

"Patsy returned home with us and preferred the ten dollars reward to the Siamese kitten we offered. She wanted to go to camp again.

"Bambeyling is now well again.

"The All-American title of course means nothing to him. Home spells his whole heaven. And we can hardly believe that we really have our 'kingly little silver animal' with us again."

CAT ATTACKS CHILD

H., a 21-month old girl, Sharon Dube, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Paul Dube, was playing on the lawn outside her home, when a cat, owned by a neighbor jumped on the child, pinned her to the ground, and bit her several times, on the left arm. 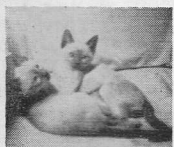

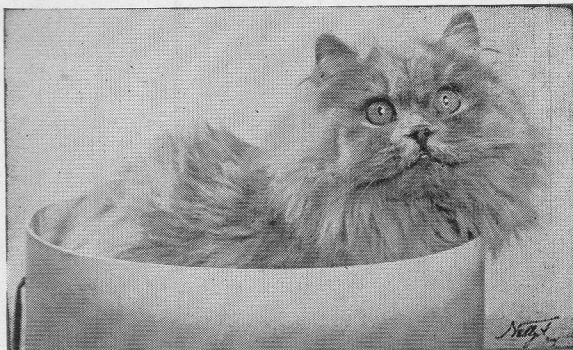

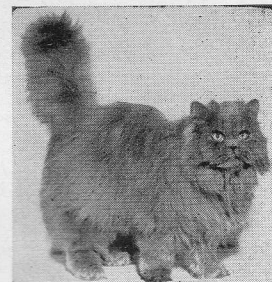

delicately, pulling at a coat sleeve until he could touch his master's face with his nose, then walk away contented. He would come when called and would wait at the gate for his master's return. "Now when the mistress was absent from home, and at no other time," Warner wrote, "Calvin would come in the morning, when the bell rang, to the head of the bed, put up his forepaws and look into my face, follow me about when I rose, 'assist' at the dressing, and in any purring ways show his fondness, as if he had plainly said, 'I know that she has gone away, but I am here.'"

The fellowship which so often exists between cats and writers was deep and strong with these two. Calvin, his master related, "had a habit of coming to my study in the morning, sitting quietly by my side or on the table for hours, watch-

ing the pen run over the paper, occasionally swinging his tail round for a blotter, and then going to sleep among the papers by the inkstand. Or, more rarely, he would watch the writing from a perch on my shoulder. Writing always interested him, and until he understood it, he wanted to hold the pen."

Calvin bore his last illness with calm resignation, purring in grateful response to his master's sympathy. When Warner spoke his name, he looked up with an expression that said, "I understand it, old fellow, but it's no use." His last look was toward the garden he loved. There he was buried under twin hawthorn-trees—one white and the other pink—in a spot where he loved to lie. His master's tribute to him: **Calvin: A Study of Character**, will always rank as one of the great cat biographies.

Mrs. Grace Thiell Rosher of Los Angeles, former silent screen actress, who devoted much of her later years with the Cat Fancy, left an estate in access of \$23,000 with funds from it to provide "better shelter and medical care" for Los Angeles' cats, according to the terms of her will filed for probate in superior court.

Mrs. Rosher died July 14 at the age of 70.

Wilson, 376 William St., East Orange, N. J. is show manager.

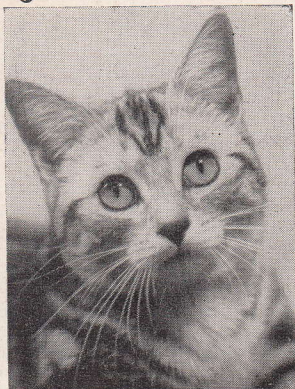
