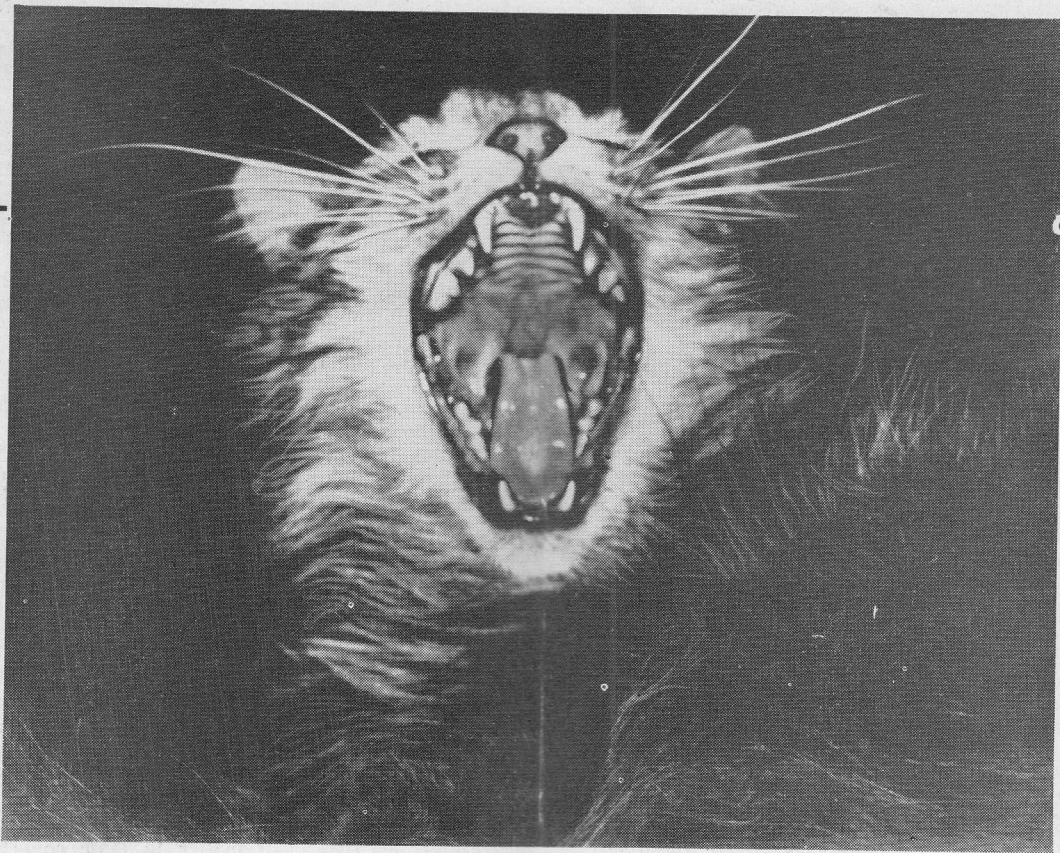

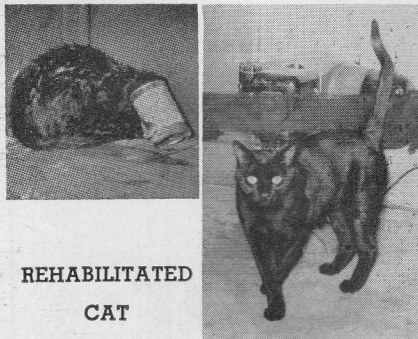
I am looking forward to the next show with great eagerness, and hope to be able to take one of my own "babies", but will have to miss many that I could attend if there were only one day instead of two days involved.

in expressing appreciation for your compliment to the Cat Fancy. We think you did a splendid piece of work in catching the spirit of a cat show, though we could have wished that the constructive rather than the sensational side had been more played up.

Cat breeding and exhibiting is a serious matter to those connected with it, so it is not surprising that with them, as with any other group of humans, not every winner is generous or every loser a good sport. Yet, from our experiences with other shows, and we are confident this must have been the case in Los Angeles as well, the general spirit is of comradeship and friendly rivalry, rather than of the fierce jealousy and unbridled competition which your story emphasized. It might be of interest that this year there will be more than sixty such shows produced in the United States and Canada by volunteer club members and that about 10,000 cats will be exhibited at them—a rather good indication that cooperation is the dominating factor.

We liked your shots of the spectators and exhibitors, and particularly the clear manner in which you showed the judges at work, but must say that we think you were less than fair to the participants, themselves. Most cats, even at shows, are the composed, lovable pets we know at home. Without doubt, Senza Coda's Little Misty was given good reason through tiredness or annoyance to spit at the photographer, and to our eyes Philip Norman's boy is not snarling at all, but is perhaps a little puzzled or scared and has opened his mouth to say a word or two about it in his own Siamese fashion.

But, thanks, again, for an overall fine presentation, and for letting your readers know about these working cats and about their breeders in the show world who over eighty years in America have been working for the improvement of all cats. George Silk and all of you merit the "Best in Show" award for yourselves!

# Cats Ride the Rails

## An Account of Some Historic and Heroic Railroad Cats

For the past nine years a pretty striped cat known as Chessie has endeared herself to the American public through her pictures on Chesapeake & Ohio Railway calendars, half a million of which are being distributed for 1953. The favorite scene shows Chessie occupying a Pullman berth, with her little head and one tiny paw resting on the pillow. "Sleep like a kitten," is the motto. During the war year of 1943 the calendar picture had her curled up snugly *underneath* a berth, on top of which lay a military cap. Title: "Lower 9 has gone to war."

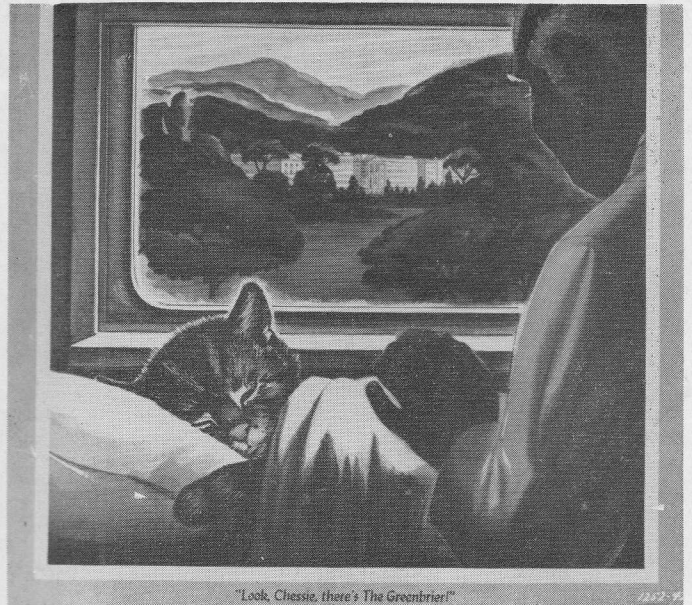
Chessie has become a national legend. Such is her popularity that about 50,000 fan letters a year addressed to her are received by the C&O. Her portrait decorates women's scarves, men's neckties, and children's T-shirts, stationery and creeper suits. There are also Chessie dolls on sale in the toy stores.

Countless numbers of household pets have been named for this animal and her mate, Peake, a handsome tomat, but neither of the originals ever existed in real life. Both were created by G. Gruenwald, an artist, to symbolize the quiet restfulness of overnight travel in a sleeping car. However, thousands of railcats all over the country are very much alive; they are the pets of railroad shops and offices, stations and roundhouses. Some of them actually ride trains. Two cats, in bygone days, were instrumental in preventing train wrecks.

One of these was Tom, the mascot at the DuQuoin, Ill., depot of the Illinois Central Railroad in the 1870s. Tom liked to ride freight locomotive No. 112 with its crew, Engineer Bob McQuaide and Fireman Walter Marsh. When the train stopped at DuQuoin the cat would simply climb aboard, curl up on the engineer's seatbox, just behind Mr. McQuaide, and stay there till they reached Carbondale, a coal-mining town 30 miles to the southwest. Then he would get off and loaf about town. When the same train halted there on its return trip, Tom would board the engine again and ride back to DuQuoin.

There is no record of this remarkable cat's ever having ridden another locomotive, not even when McQuaide and Marsh were temporarily assigned to No. 122 while the 112 was being repaired. Why that was, is hard to explain. Possibly Tom preferred the coziness of one particular seatbox or he may have been fascinated by one of the 112's glittering valves or pipes. Cats are known to be whimsical.

On one occasion a storm lashed the countryside. For days rain drummed on station roofs, spotted the track with shimmering pools, and flooded the creeks. Most cats like to stay indoors in such weather, but Tom reported for engine-cab duty as usual. Why, nobody knows.

On the night the rain ended, a pea-soup fog harassed the dispatchers. They put out slow orders all along the line. Mist smothered the 112's dim oil-burning headlight. Mr. McQuaide could see but a few yards ahead. He wasn't quite sure where they were.

The swaying engine slogged along in murky darkness. Tom crouched on the engineer's seatbox. Suddenly he let out a piercing howl. Mr. McQuaide glanced back to see if the cat had been hurt. He hadn't, but kept yowling.

"Shut up!" yelled the engineer.

Tom snarled like a cougar and clawed at the man's sleeve. His eyes were twin

balls of fire. Mr. McQuaide, who was a bit superstitious, felt alarmed.

"There's something queer about this," he muttered. "Tom never acted so before. I'm gonna see what's wrong."

Shutting off steam and setting the brakes, he swung down from the wooden cab and walked ahead, followed by Fireman Marsh. A short distance in front of the pilot—it was called the cowcatcher in those days—they came to the north bank of the Big Muddy River. Spring floods had softened the earth just above the abutment, cutting the fill from behind the masonry and leaving a great ugly hole across which the gaunt rails, with ties still attached, hung like a big spider web!

Mr. McQuaide shuddered. "Walt," he said hoarsely, "if we hadn't stopped when we did, because of that crazy cat, we'd have gone into that hole and maybe been drowned!"

Had Tom felt a presentiment of danger? Nobody knows. Cats do have acute hearing. Did Tom sense from a peculiar change in the rhythm of wheels rolling over rails that disaster threatened? Did he howl at the right time because of a weird jungle instinct? Or was it mere coincidence? After more than three-quarters of a century, the reason behind his action is still a mystery.

A famous train-riding cat was Bingo, who lived in the Erie Railroad depot at Warren, Ohio, and had a penchant for travel. Back in 1944 he was hopping a baggage car two or three times a week, riding to Jamestown, N.Y., and other points east but invariably returning to Warren on some other train. Depot employees, worried by his frequent absences, gave him a collar, to which they attached a metal tag containing his name and address.

Another traveler was Toby, feline mascot of the Canadian National Railways roundhouse at Calgary, Alberta. One day Tabby took her little family

## IMPROVING THE BREEDING OF CATS

By Alice Hahn

*Introduction*

A breeder acquaintance to whom the author confided her intention of writing this article, expressed the opinion "that people would think you conceited because you have to be in this cat business ten or twenty years before you know anything. You will get in trouble with influential people. Don't do it."

However, we prefer the advice of British philosopher, Bertrand Russell, who told academic Americans to ascertain the truth on any matter that one is studying, and to penetrate through the wall of myth and prejudice by which tradition and authority attempt to hide the truth. Then when you think that you have discovered the truth about any matter as to which preconceptions and selfish interests are apt to lead people astray, that you should not be restrained from expressing your opinion by the fear of offending those who hold power.

Well, a cat may look at a king, so we may look at a cat, attempt to record our observations and conclusions constructively, and Socratically ask some questions.

*The Aim*

Improvement is the aim of all breeders, whether it be the breeding of cats, dogs, birds, mink, or cattle, but just what is an advance in type? It depends on your purpose.

Cattle breeders are interested in getting the most of the best quality beef possible on one animal, so they work for heavy bodies with short legs, which mean little action. Action causes tough muscles and uses up food instead of building weight. The rangy long-horns disappeared.

Fox farms have given way to mink ranches. Why? The whim of fashion decrees a slim silhouette. Fox gave a bulky effect. Breeders of mink work for color as well as quality of fur, the market demanding platinum, and blue, as well as the browns. "Sapphire" blue mink is the highest priced fur in the world today, according to the proprietor of Donat's Fur Farm in Wallingford, Connecticut. There is little demand for chinchilla, as it does not wear well.

Breeders of dogs desire acute sense of smell in bloodhounds, speed in whippets, high intelligence in German shepherds (often trained for police and war service, as well as guides for the blind), ability to enter rodent's holes as a peculiarity of the dachshund, and so it goes. These traits are deliberately sought and the animal's appearance is modified by them eventually. Breeders of the show-type collie narrowed the head until it resembled the Russian wolf-hound, but the ordinary, smaller dog is still the best herder of sheep.

What do cat breeders want and why? One sometimes wonders. Certainly we should ask ourselves some questions.

*Criterion*

The classic Greek criterion was 'the good, the true, the beautiful.'

1. Is it an improvement *esthetically*? To know the answer one should understand the basic art principles of line, form, color, and rhythm. Some artists have deliberately caricatured the Siamese cat, elongating and narrowing the contours ridiculously, but that is their privilege to distort in design. Surely we do not expect to reproduce it in flesh and blood cats.

2. Is it an improvement *anatomically*? A structural improvement can only be considered in relation to function. For example, cats' hips should be higher than the shoulders as this gives the powerful spring, the manner in which they attack their prey. That is why it is natural and beautiful. A kink in the tail has no use and should be bred out. It is a double recessive character.

3. Is the aim an *impossibility*? The expression "snakey" is being suggested as a desirable head type in Siamese. Cats have naturally flat head bones, as may be seen in the study of the skeleton. So does a snake, in a much greater degree, and that is the only similarity. The Creator designed a class of vertebrates, the warm blooded quadrupeds whose females have milk secreted for their young. Felines belong to this class. They have no resemblance to cold blooded reptiles, which swallow their food alive and whole. Cats' jaws have teeth for tearing and chewing as well as powerful muscles for holding. For this reason an undershot jaw is bad in a cat. "You can't reduce the mammalian type head to the reptilian", maintains Dr. John S. Nicholas of the Department of Zoology, Yale University.

4. Is it *healthy*? What are we doing to cats? Check on the length of life of "typey" specimens, and their progeny, if any. Look back at the winners of 15 years ago, or more, and see the difference. A skinny, narrow boned Siamese female will have difficulty in giving birth, perhaps require a Caesarian section for delivery. More and more kittens are being raised artificially by bottle feeding. Is in-breeding one of the causes? Why not allow more than five points for condition? Some breeders believe judging has often been 90% head, whereas the standards allow only 25%, including eyes and ears. Persian breeders strive for the Peke nose, which when attained causes susceptibility to respiratory diseases, such as asthma and pneumonia.

5. Are we getting away from the standards and trying to produce bizarre effects? Are the standards demanding abnormalities?

*Some important facts on breeding:*

1. Reduction of the lower jaw is a mark of degeneration.
2. It takes five generations to establish a pure line. That is, with

pedigreed stock, but even then, odd things may appear from time to time.

3. Uniformity throughout a litter indicates a very good normal breeding.

4. Trial by selection is the way to eliminate weakness, or an undesirable inherited trait.

5. Inbreeding worsens undesirable factors, as well as strengthening those which are desired.

*Suggestions for the breeder to increase his knowledge.*

We are not of the school of thought which believes that judges, are born, not made. One should have an open mind, always ready to learn. We are born with certain potentialities, certain aptitudes, but we must develop them by study, by trial and error, and by consultation with scholars of the subject.

An understanding of the Mendelian Law and reproduction would show those people who believe "double conception" possible that they err. Double conception is impossible, as only one male, the first to fertilize the ova, is the sire. Subsequent relations with another are too late. In the case of a Siamese female who delivered a litter of four common kittens and one Siamese, all five were mongrels, and they had the same father, the barn cat. The Siamese male's relations came afterwards, too late, for the common barn cat had already fertilized the ova. The one kitten appearing to be Siamese simply "took after" the mother, the others resembled the father, but all five, being cross-bred, inherited certain contrasting and determining factors which subsequent generations will manifest in varying combinations from dominant to recessive, each combination being present in a definite proportion of the total number of off-spring.

The following outline gives a *course of study*, which will aid the breeder and save him perhaps considerable time in achieving his aim of improving his breeding:

1. Purchase or borrow a book on biology, read it all, but pay special attention to the section on zoology. Such topics as classification, anatomy, reproduction, Mendel's Law, respiration, circulation, nutrition, digestion, are invaluable.

2. Read "Cats" and "All-Pets" magazines for many interesting articles on genetics.

3. By observation at shows and catteries, find the stud or queen which complements your cat, which has strength where yours is weak.

4. Become familiar with the standards.

So, breeders, have an inquiring mind towards your subject, determine to reach your goal intelligently, knowing what you are doing, and why.



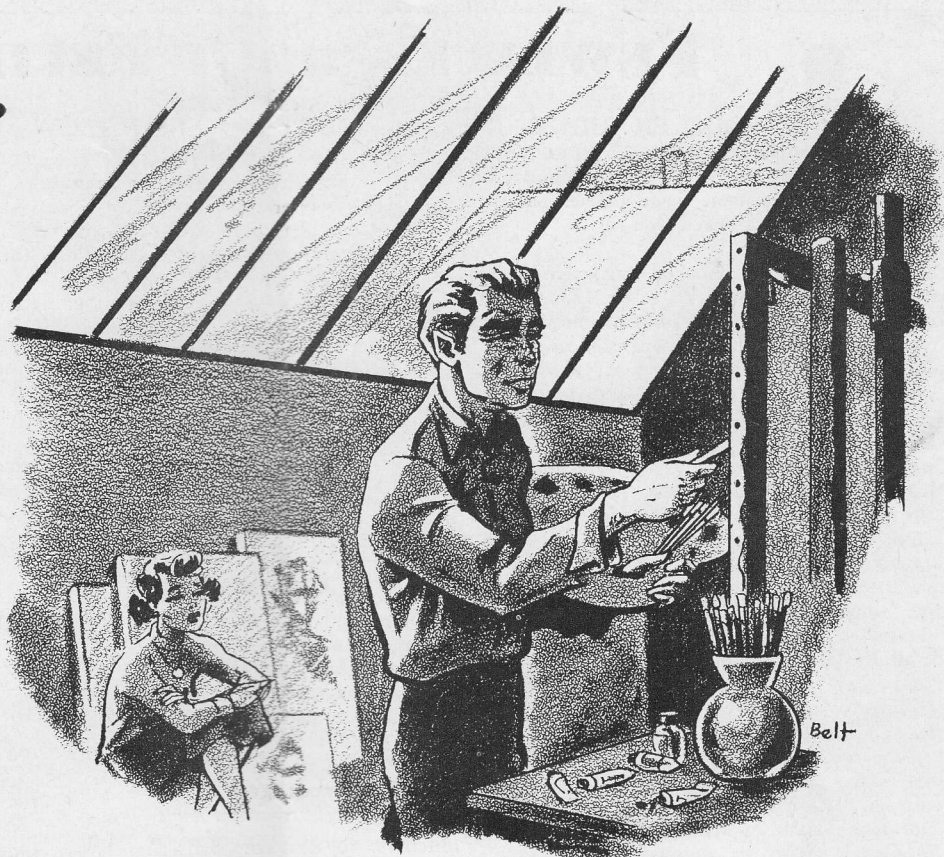
# Are Cats REALLY People?

Early last February, Miss Kathleen Yorke, returned to her home in England from an assignment of judging in Rotterdam, and found a letter awaiting her from America, asked if she would judge the Garden State Show at Newark, New Jersey, on the third and fourth of December—? This date she refused and cabled to this effect as her own National Cat Club show was arranged for the third of December and as she had already accepted the honor of judging she just could do nothing about America but turn the offer down. Within a few days, she had another contact, asking if she could come to America for the ninth and tenth of December? The date had been changed for her convenience alone. Miss Yorke was overjoyed at the gracious gesture and accepted the engagement. While in America she will judge the Mo-Kan show in Kansas City as well as the Garden State Cat Club.

Miss Yorke is at present, the Chairman of The Governing Council of the Cat Fancy of Great Britain, an honor she well deserves. Mr. P. M. Soderberg states 'that no one in The Fancy is held in higher esteem and that the task that confronts a Chairman of this body is not an easy one'. Were she in America we'd call her the President of this body but in England she is designated as the Chairman, the highest of the high offices over there. Before accepting this office she was a delegate on the Council for twenty-five years. (There are thirty-six delegates on the Council representing all the various Cat Clubs).

Miss Yorke has been a judge since 1934, has judged many, many times in France, Switzerland, Holland, Belgium, Sweden and Denmark. To mention only a few of the Clubs: The Cat Club De Paris, Societe Feline De Cannes Et De La Cote, Societe Central Feline De France, the Federation Feline Francaise. A few of the cities she officiated as a Judge, were Paris, Niorte, Bourg, Nice, Cannes, also the Cat Club Vaudois, (Switzerland), Nederlandsche Veerniging VanFokkers, En Liefhebbers Van Ratten, in Holland. In Belgium it was the Societe Feline Des Flanders, and The Svenska Kattklubben in Sweden and the Racekatten in Denmark.

One of the highlights of this remarkable lady's career was an honor given to her in Paris. This was when she was made an honorary member, unanimously, at the Assembly General, in appreciation of her help in getting the French Cat Fancy on their feet again after the war.

One of Miss Yorke's outstanding traits is her ability to mix with all classes of the Fancy. She has proved herself as a sincere friend to both the older breeders and the Novices, this is of course of much value to The Fancy.

As for breeding—her Culloden Cattery has had few equals if any. One of the first cats she ever possessed was pur-

chased from Miss Francis Simpson, (England's greatest authority on cats). Since that time she has bred Blues, Blacks, Creams, Bluecreams and a few White Persians. Yes, and one Tortoiseshell champion named Anne Goodcat. A few of her other champions were Hillington Jackdaw, Laughton's Laurel. Ch. Casino Luck was probably the most famous White Persian ever bred in England, he was shown before twelve judges—at seven years of age) and was given the honor of the Best Exhibit in the Show. Windways Fortune was his daughter, she had the deepest of deep blue eyes. Windways was the mother of Correg Comfort and won eight championships. Comfort was never beaten. International Champion Carreg Cracker won many championships and was even more beautiful than Comfort. This particular strain of White Persians have children and great-grand-children all over the world. Barbara of Culloden was truly a treasure, she had many lovely children of the palest of pale blue. This color seems to have been lost to many breeders of Blue cats. Some of Barbara's kittens went to India to His Royal Highness Maharawat Sir Ram Sigh Bahadur of Partabgarh Rajputana. Every Christmas there come cards to Miss Yorke from His Highness and his cats—sending her the season's greetings.

Some of the well known names of her champions are Hillington's Black Star, Ch. Hillington's Hebe, Ch. Black Bess of Culloden, Ch. Black Pat of Culloden, Dick Turpin of Culloden, Nani of Culloden. Mdme. Ravel's Int. Ch. Jackdaw Madoura was a grandson of Ch. Hillington's Jackdaw. Laughton's Play Boy came to America to live with Miss Elsie G. Hydon.

It will probably be a surprise to many of Miss Yorke's friends to know that she has a treasured Blue Point Siamese living at her home. He is owned by a Mrs. MacDonald but he spends most of his time at Birchwood Farm with Miss Yorke, who loves him dearly. This handsome boy is six years old and is named Reward Blue Sacha.

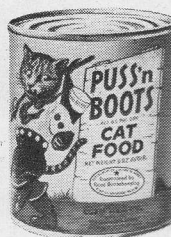

## SODERBURG ON CAT HEALTH

Brant House's New Pet Album

*ABC OF CAT DISEASES* by P. M. Soderberg. All Pets Books, Fond du Lac, Wisconsin. 64 pages - 85 cents. Illustrations by Lynn Hamilton.

In this book the author has taken up 93 diseases and physical changes to which the cat is subject. Those conditions are listed in the table of contents and are in alphabetical order throughout the book. This makes it very easy to find any subject easily and quickly.

There are two schematic drawings showing the relative positions of the internal organs. As in most of these types of figures there are a few inaccuracies, but for the average cat owner this is of no consequence.

The discussions of the various conditions are handled very well. No attempt has been made to get technical or to inject any theory which would serve only to confuse and detract from the main purpose of the book.

The treatments suggested are those that, if used correctly, should help to give relief for the existing condition. However, all through the book the author points out that if the cat owner isn't sure it is best to see a veterinarian be-

fore doing anything. Also, if no improvement is noticed after home treatment for a few days, it is wisest to get professional aid.

Under the section of burns use of Mercurachrome is suggested. As cats are very sensitive to mercury products it would be best not to use this preparation on them even in very dilute solutions.

A valuable addition to the poison section would be the universal poison antidote. This can be made up of items found in most homes. This antidote consists of:

2 parts burned toast (pulverized charcoal)

1 part Milk of Magnesia

1 part strong tea

Give at least two tablespoonsful antidote with water.

Induce vomiting

Give second dose of antidote

Get veterinarian.

This antidote is good for almost all poisons and as a rule the type of poison is usually not known. If a caustic poison has been taken and there are burns in the mouth, DO NOT induce vomiting. Get professional aid as quickly as possible.

The book is a good one for cat owners to have. There are no gross exaggerations or misrepresentations which are, as a rule, the downfall of a good many pet books. There is very little possibility of the reader drawing any false conclusions.—E. A. Renaux, D.V.M.

*The Book of Pets*, edited by Brant House. A. A. Wyn, New York. \$2.50.

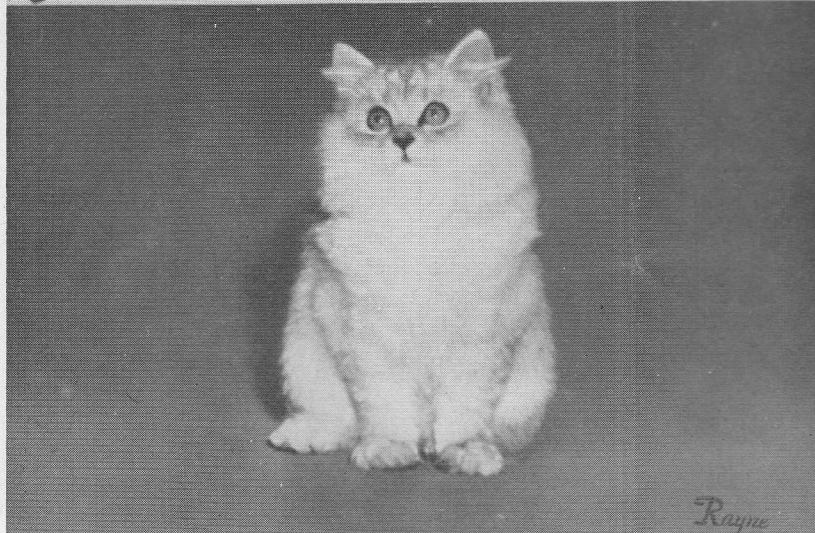
Brant House, who is known to all cat lovers for his two previous collections of photographs—*The Book of Cats* and *The Book of Kittens*—has concentrated this time on bringing together some 130 top flight photos of all kinds of pets.

In his newest book Mr. House has leaned heavily on children as props or straight men for the pets, usually with happy results, and especially so if the book is to be read by children. Adults might occasionally wish that the pets were allowed the stage by themselves more often. But in most cases the children add as much as the animals to the picture.

The animals shown range from birds, frogs, and fish through mammals of almost every kind, including, of course, a full portion of cats and kittens and of the larger members of the feline family. Walter Chandoha is generously represented, not only with some fine cat pictures, but with dogs, monkeys, and even goats . . . all done with his usual skill. The other photographers are less well known to cat lovers, but H. Armstrong Roberts is the most frequent contributor.

We can promise that this book will be of absorbing interest to any young person and to all lovers of animals. —R.G.

## COPENHAGEN SHOW

"RACEKATTEN'S International Cat Show at 'FORUM's' annex in Copenhagen the 7th - 8th and 9th November this year was a very great success with more than 12,000 visitors, which is more than hitherto seen at any Cat Show in Europe. The show had an excellent publicity, it was mentioned in all the daily papers and even the smokepilot wrote in the blue sky: SEE THE PURE-BRED CATS IN FORUM.

Judges were Miss Kathleen Yorke, chairman of the Governing Council of the Cat Fancy and Mrs. Joan Thompson, England, both well known to our American friends.

The show room was beautifully decorated with flowers on all the pens and with green trees all over the room, besides which the exhibitors had decorated their pens with very practical plastic curtains.

There were a lot of very beautiful Persians, Blue Russians and Siamese Cats and both judges found that the cats had improved considerably since they had last judged in Scandinavia, apparently on account of the good English queens and the good Scandinavian males at disposal. Consequently the judges also had a very difficult choice to find the Best Cat in Show and not until a referee judge had been appointed, TWINKLE of PENSFORD, a lovely blue cream Persian cat ex Astra of Pensford was made Best in Show.

Best Shorthair cat was "MORRIS SABLE", owned by Mrs. Anna Poulsen and bred by Mrs. Richardson, England.

Best kitten in Show was a seal-pointed female SILKEN ROSY RASCAL, a lovely kitten of 8 months, excelling in type, beautiful markings and wonderful sapphire eyes.

Another lovely specimen was the blue male GIPPESWYK DARBY, a fine well built cat with a beautiful pale blue colour and a long flowing coat of good texture, which got the C.A.C.I.B. Also the blue female RONADA ONAWAY got her C.A.C.I.B.

It will be impossible to mention all the beautiful and really well-bred cats at the Show, but the Show proved that the Scandinavian fanciers have made great progress and that their cats may compare with any cats in any country of Europe.

"RACEKATTEN" is affiliated with the Federation Internationale Feline d'Europe, Paris, chairman of which is by the way the president of "RACEKATTEN", Mrs. Rudy Eisenhuth, for the running period.

Just after the Show in Copenhagen Miss Kathleen Yorke left to judge in U.S.A. We hope that she will write us a little about the American cats in comparison with ours and would also be glad to receive letters direct from American fanciers.

## Cats Question Box

How much salt should I put on the horse meat or cat food that I give to my half-grown Blue-eyed White Long Hair?

—Mrs. L.L.P., Ronkonkoma, L.I., N.Y.

Animals which eat only grasses and other vegetation seem to require considerable amounts of salt—cows and antelopes, for example; but cats and other carnivores who live on meat exclusively apparently get all the minerals they need indirectly through their normal food. Cats who are fed mainly on meat and fish should not require additional salt in their diet. Only if a cat is fed mainly on vegetables, and this we do not recommend, should it be necessary to add salt to its food.

My cat has had much trouble with an eye infection, and I can't seem to find anything to help it. What would you suggest?

—Miss W.W.P., Seattle, Wash.

You might suggest to your Veterinarian that he try Terramycin. Dr. Lloyd C. Moss, D.S., V.M.D., of Fort Collins, Colo. recently reported in the Journal of the American Veterinary Assn. the case of a male cat, 4 years old, who had been doctored at home for two weeks for seriously infected eyes, and who was then treated in a hospital for twenty-five days with numerous drugs and antibiotics, all without apparent benefit. At this point, Terramycin ophthalmic in liquid was tried. After four days of application, three times a day, marked improvement was noted and the cat was dismissed as recovered after eleven days of treatment.

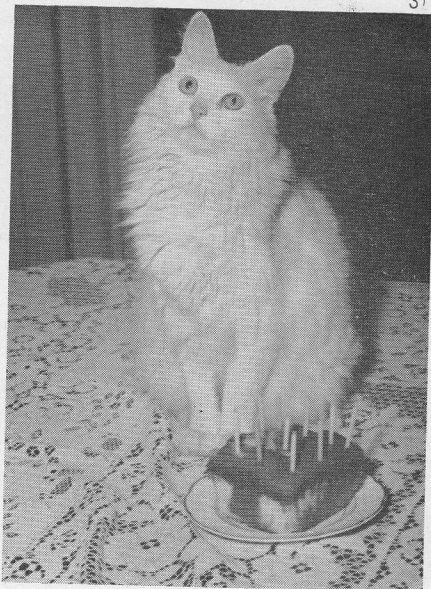

Until quite recently, inherited deafness was very frequent in Blue-Eyed and Odd-Eyed White cats, but leading breeders have been concentrating on eliminating this defect by selective breeding and it is thought that within a few generations a completely true-breeding sound-hearing strain may be established. Meanwhile, however, Tuffy, and other similarly handicapped cats are finding ways to overcome their limitations and lead full, happy lives.

free ride on the center casting truck of an oil-electric car, on a 494-mile round trip between Calgary and Edmonton. But she overstayed her stopover privilege, probably because she was scouting around for food for the tiny kittens, and the train returned to Calgary without her but with the kittens still on board.

A day and a half passed. The kittens came back to Edmonton on the same car, completing their third trip between the two points. Tabby was waiting anxiously for them, but by that time the babies had died of starvation. The bereaved mother accompanied the little bodies back to Calgary and took them off the car one at a time. A machinist's helper buried them just outside the roundhouse.

Also in Canada, a cat named Minnie boarded the boxcar of a freight train that stood in the Ottawa yards. Someone shut the door and the train ran to Moncton, N.B. Yardmen there found the cat and removed her to a small room in the freight shed, posting on the door a sign reading, "Maternity Ward—Quiet, Please!" That afternoon the gadabout gave birth to quadruplets. A telegram from Ottawa frantically inquired where Minnie was. After debating for some time as to whether the kittens were Ottawans or Monctonians, the New Brunswick railroad men finally shipped the whole family to the Canadian capital.

Residents of Wismer, Neb., will tell you of Puff's train trip to Stanton, 20 miles away, on the Chicago & North Western Railway. How this kitten got aboard is not known. Luckily, the porter recognized Puff as belonging to Wismer folks, so he locked up the kitten in the Stanton baggage room and then, on his return trip, told the owner where to find it. Ralph Belmer made a 40-mile round trip in his automobile, bringing Puff back home.

Then there was Old Tom, a famous cat who made his headquarters in Louisville, Ky., freight house and was a successful that station men in other parts on the Nashville, Chattanooga and St. Louis Railway borrowed him to run out rodents. Thus he became quite a traveler.

In fact, there have been so many train-riding cats that there is not space to mention even all the well-known ones in this article. One tomcat, in South America, made a practice of riding on the locomotive pilot through the Andes Mountains, right out in front where he could get a wonderful view of the scenery. At one time he was attacked by a great bird but was so badly injured by the time the engineer came to his help that he was permanently crippled.

Another railcat frequented a certain ferry owned by the P. & M. Marquette Railroad (now part of the Erie, Lackawanna & Ohio). He would board the ferry at Ludington, Mich., across Lake Michigan,

and debark at Manitowoc to transact whatever business a car-ferry mascot may have at a lake port. Then, hearing the call whistle of his boat, he would hurry back to the dock. He never missed reporting in time to pussyfoot up the gangplank.

That cat had a real personality. So did Tom, one of four "Maltese" kittens born in 1905 in the cellar of the Louisville, Ky., union station. Shortly after his birth, the depot caught fire. As flames roared overhead and stone fragments fell around the mewling feline family, water from firemen's hoses began to rise in the basement. Mrs. Cat made desperate efforts to remove her offspring to higher ground but succeeded in saving only Tom.

A few days later the mother was killed by an engine, leaving poor Tom, a wild-eyed frightened stray, hiding in the depot ruins and fleeing at the sight of human beings. Eventually he mustered up enough courage to scrape up an acquaintance with the night station master, George Rogers. In time he became a sleek railroad mascot, smart enough to keep away from rolling wheels, and lived, it is said, nearly sixteen years.

Speaking of station cats brings to mind Tom and Jerry, respectively black and gray, who flourished in the Baltimore & Ohio's Mt. Royal Station at Baltimore, Md. Tom would wait on the station platform until the *Capitol Limited*, a crack train, pulled in. He knew just where the dining car would stop and seldom had to move an inch to reach it. The cook invariably had a plate of scraps for him. He never missed the *Capitol Limited* and never met any other train.

Jerry, the other Mt. Royal mascot, followed a different procedure. He burrowed for rats in the coal pile in the cellar of the station, thus feeding himself but dirtying his gray fur. One day Daniel Willard, president of the railroad, saw the grimy animal and requested a porter to see that Jerry was given a thorough bath once a week.

We now come to what might be called, to paraphrase Charles Dickens, "A Tale of Two Kitties." Marlene Wendt, aged 13, who lived near the Texas & Pacific Railway tracks at Oxford, La., wept because her coal-black cat, Cinder, met death under a train. She wrote a letter about it to the railroad, closing with these words:

"I loved my cat very much and was very sorry when he was killed."

The railroad company also felt sorry when her letter arrived. Officials went to considerable trouble to get her another perfectly black cat to replace Cinder. A railroad carpenter built a handsome box for him, painting on its lid the name "Cinder the Second."

It was a gala day when this cat was presented to Marlene. The principal of Marlene's school gave her special permission to stay out a half-day. Marlene baked a chocolate cake, covering it with thick icing. She stabbed herself in a

new plaid dress. A gay crowd of town-folk gathered at the little depot to watch the ceremony.

The engineer of the regular passenger train, carrying the cat-box, descended from his cab and handed the gift to Marlene, while newspaper reporters made notes and photographers snapped pictures.

"Thank you very much," the girl said shyly, "and now I want you to have this cake. I baked it especially for the railroad."

Engineer Hargrove cut the cake and passed it around. Then Marlene climbed up into the cab to get her picture taken with the new cat. The whole affair lasted eighteen minutes. Marlene, excited and blissful, was holding the cat in her arms when the train puffed away.

The conductor shouted, "Tell Cinder the Second not to play on the tracks!" "Oh, I will!" she yelled ecstatically.

Thus a big railroad company gave a little girl the biggest day in her life.

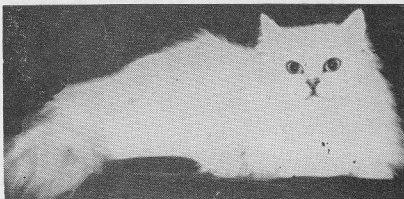

## The Back Fence . . . .

A New Year laden with good luck for all our readers, and as many miles of progress at its end as there are miles of flat Santa Fe track across the western plains. Hope that you sail smoothly through the year, too, like the Santa Fe trains, with a minimum of huffing and puffing. The same for your cats, although Nature boosts them along more readily as a rule than it does us recalcitrant humans.

Speaking of progress, the leopard cub which was being nursed by a cat last month at the Milwaukee Zoo is now with the New Year's coming as big as its foster mother. The cat, Blue Baby, and the leopard get along well, though the diet of the cub, a male, is now supplemented by formula and ground meat. Blue Baby's three kittens are doing fine under tutelage of a Pomperian dog, Snowflake, and Snowflake's one puppy is thriving under the care of Jill, another Pomperian also blessed with one offspring. Blue Baby, who ordinarily lives with Miss Viola Van Dieman of 1737 N. 4th St., Milwaukee, has been awarded the bronze Puss 'N Boots medal "for contributing to human happiness and exhibiting other admirable traits" and further elevating "the cat as mans friend, loyal companion, vigilant protector."

John Klowowski, landlord of an apartment at 1708 Summerfield St., Ridgewood, L. I., N. Y. is having his head examined at Kings County Hospital. He was sent there for tests by Magistrate Charles F. Murphy after 13 tenants testified that he: failed to supply heat and hot water; made love to the women occupants; threw live cats into the furnace, evidently as fuel. One of the tenants, Mrs. Bertha Gaejiler, said: "One day when he (Mr. Klowowski) came to fix the plumbing, he threw his arms around me and began hugging me." And her husband, she added, was in the next room. Others said whenever the question of heat came up, Klowowski flew into a rage. Still other tenants charged that Klowowski put live cats in the furnace . . . but if the superintendent tried to build up the fire with coal, the landlord doused the fire with water. A year ago at Christmas time, six residents were felled by coal gas, and small wonder.

Mrs. Lena Portratz, of 178 Vermont St., Buffalo, N. Y. reported her seven-weeks old kitten missing to the A.S.P. C.A. and agents of the Society searched for it the following Saturday and Sunday with no success. Meanwhile, the proprietor of a barbershop on the ground floor of the building complained that his gas stove was blocked. A.S.P.C.A. Agent Leonard T. Aronica, acting on a hunch, investigated and found the kitten stuck in an elbow of the stove pipe. The kitten, naturally grey, was coal-black and exhausted from its ordeal, but glad to be alive. It was not asphyxiated by gas fumes from the stove as it was stuck with head facing the chimney-opening on

the roof.

All the VOTE AS YOU PLEASE—BUT VOTE propaganda which turned out large numbers of voters this past Election Day must have been effective with felines, too. In Danville, Ky., J. J. Isaacs, who had worried for 3 days about his missing pet cat, arrived at the polls to find it waiting there for him.

Also on Election Day, a young stray kitten found refuge with Mr. and Mrs. Larry Snelson, of 90 River Rd., Teaneck, N. J. The excitement of a new home on Election Day may have been too much, at any rate, the kitten disappeared into a hole in the wall made by a pipe. The bashful one stayed in the space between the walls of two rooms for five days. No amount of coaxing would bring it out. Food was left which it would touch only in the middle of the night when no one was around. Mr. Snelson tried to make the hole larger, but this only drove the kitten further back into the wall. At last, the local Dog Warden offered use of a squirrel trap. Food was put in the trap, puss came out for its meal and the door of the trap closed behind. Puss calmed down after a while, was sent to the vets for a check-up. Mrs. Snelson, a cat lover, would like to keep it on its return, although her cat of long-standing, Tallulah, is so far not happy about the newcomer.

Last Election Item from Rich Hill, Mo.: Mrs. Dorothy Booth's (Republican) Sister, Florence, has named the new female feline Mamie Micenhower.

In case you're wondering how to smuggle a cat into Europe this coming summer, the ban on entering cats and dogs in Northern Ireland has now been lifted. Originally the restriction was inaugurated as a check on hoof-and-mouth disease.

Coming in the other direction, happily there is no long and, we feel, senseless quarantine, which fact may have been one reason Dr. Thomas R. A. Davis readily packed the two family kittens along when he and his family and 2-man crew sailed on a 48-ft. ketch from New Zealand to Boston. Most unfortunately, the kittens did not survive, but upon arrival in Boston, two identical black kittens were presented to the Davis children, John 10, and Timothy, 5. Mr. Davis, a part-Polynesian physician, will study at Harvard University under a fellowship grant.

A rote from Rugby, England, tells us that the railroad station at neighboring Brinklow (Pop. 950) is closing down because the "railway executive pays as much to feed Kitty, the jet-black station cat, as is its average weekly income from tickets." Kitty doesn't live in luxury, being allotted only three pints of milk each week by the British Railways in payment for keeping the cattle cars free of rats and mice. But the peace of the station is disturbed so seldom by trains that not three-pints-worth of passengers embark or disembark weekly. Be-

sides, buses service the area adequately. We trust Kitty will find a good home somewhere when the station is no longer in use, for her faithful past service.

Mrs. Olive Beatty, of Marion, Ohio, U. S. A., left \$40,000 in her will for the establishment of a non-profit corporation to aid cats, birds, and other animals. The remaining \$22,000 of her estate was left to friends, neighbors and her church. We're glad the animals got a lion's share this time, for usually they get nothing, which may be all right, too, but as the saying goes, never get ahead *that* way.

A stray cat taken into the home of a Winnipeg, Manitoba, woman can be pretty certain of *his* future from now on. His mistress was awakened by his crying at 5 A.M. the other night to find a blaze had started in the bedroom from a cigarette.

Tabby, cat of the Lawrence Wisebeck's of Bowman, N. Dak., also has established his place in the family rather firmly. Tabby was given to a farmer 28 miles from Bowman because the Weisbeck's thought he would be happier with more space, fresh milk, and field mice. But Tabby walked the 28 miles back to Bowman and the Weisbeck home, where he'll now remain.

Saw a picture of Patrolman L. O. ("Happy") Doyle, of the Second Precinct, in the Norfolk Times-Dispatch as he fed homeless cats and one stray dog left behind in the near-deserted slum clearance area east of Bank Street, Norfolk. When razing of buildings in the area began, such homes as the animals may have had were destroyed, nor will there be other houses with other people to feed them, until the new living units are ready, some time in the future. Patrolman Doyle, who has been with the Norfolk Police Division for 25 years, sometimes has as many as 60 cats to feed from his box of fish. In the picture mentioned above, there were cats of all sizes, shapes and colors, visible, as well as kittens, and the starved little dog with his tail between his legs.

A clipping about Officer Doyle was sent us by Mrs. C. Edward Voke who reports that immediately upon its printing the Domestic Short Hair Club of the South conferred an Honorary Membership upon him. Mrs. Voke and her fellow club member Mrs. Lee Carnahan have personally purchased two cases of food to aid in Mr. Doyle's feeding program. We hope there are others in Norfolk who can see their way clear to share a little of the burden Patrolman Doyle lifted voluntarily to his shoulders.

Good recipes for a New Year's resolution: picture in one's mind a scrawny, mangy stray cat; enumerate adverbs denoting measurements of time, as, weekly, semi-monthly, monthly, quarterly, semi-annually and annually; put these two thoughts together, resolving that we will better the lot of one such cat as often each year as the adverb we felt able to pick designates. Hard work but *not* impossible, even when one has healthy cats at home to consider.—A.M.
