## DIET IN "COMPLETE"

Dear Editors:

I have read *The Complete Book of Cats* (reviewed in May) and would like to question two or three points in the book about diet.

The author advises against feeding pork to a cat, but you will be interested to know that I now have some very nice pedigreed Siamese cats in the third generation who have never tasted any food except pork.

The book also suggests a raw egg once or twice per week, but feeding raw eggs this often could easily lead to a vitamin B (Biotin) deficiency. Raw egg contains an anti-biotin factor which destroys this essential vitamin, not only in the egg, but in all the other food consumed in the same meal.

The author advises her readers to stay away from pedigree cats unless they have a great deal of time to groom them. Obviously, any kitten is improved by intelligent grooming, but let's not create the impression that pedigree cats have to be babied just because we happen to know who their ancestors are.

### 724 CATS COMPETE IN WEST

1955-56 marked a great show season for the West with 724 different cats being scored for All-Western and Western Honorable Mention points. A total of 144 CATS awards are listed in the A-W section.

Highest-scoring cat in the West is the nationally-famous Blue Point Siamese male Tpl. Gr. Ch. Tempurra's Yours Truly owned by Mr. and Mrs. Richard Birkett. "Y-T" appeared in 20 All Breed and 20 Specialty Shows in all parts of the United States and in Canada. Among the wins which made up his high total are 11 times Best Cat in Specialty Shows, twice Best Cat in All Breeds, twice Best Cat in Shorthair Division of UCF All Breed Shows, once Second Best Cat in A.B., once BOX Cat in A.B. and 25 times Best of Color. This beautiful San Francisco boy was the A-W Male Kitten in 1954, and in 1955 he was the top Western Shorthair and second highest cat. He now tries for Cat-of-the-Year.

Mrs. V. Osburn Peterson's beautiful Silver Gr. and Quint. Ch. La Chatta of Beverly-Serrano takes first place for the girls and is the leading Western Longhair. She will compete with the females of other sections for O.S. Cat-of-the-Year.

Youth must be served, and of this year's winners, only one has a record as far back as 1950—but that one is none other than Gr. Ch. Pied Piper of Barbe Bleue, the great Black male who in 1951 was Cat-of-the-Year. Other consistent records are those of Folly Sabu and Quad. Ch. Billig's Patina who began their A-W careers in 1951. Twenty-two cats are repeating '55 wins, 13 others go back to '54, and two to '53.

Mrs. Nathalie Pyle, Mrs. Olive Hall, and Mrs. Chris Klinkhammer lead in number of winners with five each. Mrs. V. Osburn Peterson, Mrs. Donald J. Cockeram, and Mrs. Pearl Allison have four winners, with five fanciers gaining three and two wins each going to 16 owners.

### ALL-MIDWEST WINNER REPEATS

Leading the 1956 All-Midwesters is Mrs. Frances Kosierowski's great Cream Longhair male Dbl. Gr. Ch. Rosemont's Golden Boy. Entered in nine Specialty and nine All Breed Shows, Golden Boy made the remarkable record of Best Cat in seven All Breeds and five Specialties. He was also Second Best Cat in one A.B. and one Specialty. Such wins are nothing new to the pride of the Midwest, for he was the highest-scoring cat in his section in 1955 as well. Now he will compete with the other top All-Sectionals for the Cat-of-the-Year title.

Dbl. Ch. Wah-Lee Nang of Livingston is one of seven cats who won for Mrs. Ruth Coe Livingston the honor of having the most 1956 Midwest winners, but in addition, this Seal Point Siamese is the Midwest female cat with the highest score, making her the candidate for O.S. Cat-of-the-Year against the leading ladies of the other sections.

The ten top cats are listed in the box below—among other leading performers are: Dbl. Ch. Dol-li-San of the Churches, Best Manx; and Tpl. Ch. Silver Girl of My-Lo, Best DSH.

Close behind Mrs. Livingston's seven-win total are Marie Wilson with six and Mrs. Dorothy B. Anderson and Mrs. Kay Thoma McQuillen who have four each. Eleven Midwest fanciers had three winners and nine others had two. Altogether an even 500 Midwest cats were scored for honors, and 134 won A-M or MHM awards.

Tpl. Ch. Ba-Lo's Queen Desira made her first win in 1947 and has scored in four other years since then. Other old-timers are Gr. Ch. Sista Barney Google (1950) and Tpl. Gr. Ch. Lee's Hi-Hat Champaign, Tpl. Ch. Ahmaq of Katnip Korner, Tpl. Ch. Eastmoor Robyn Maroon, and Grey Lady of Gallus—all initiated in 1952. Four others date back to '53 and nine to '54. Complete records follow each cat's name in the individual listing.

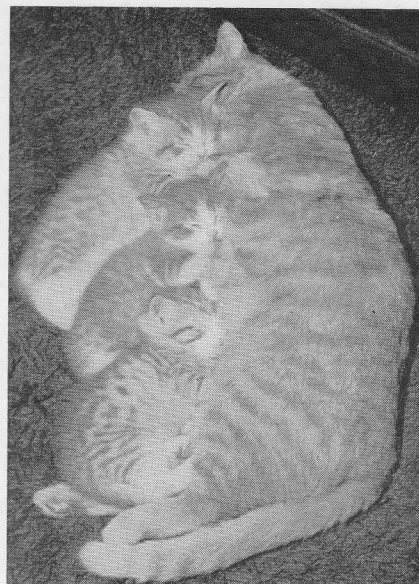

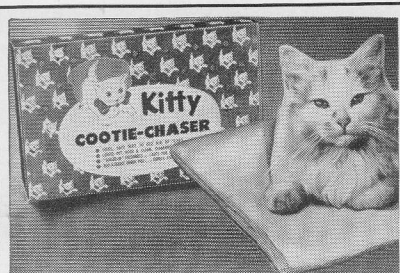
even her beloved Mr. Dandy could not provide the comfort she needed most of all.

# CYSTITIS AND RINGWORM—

'Tips to  
the Novice'

Two new products for the treatment of cystitis and fungus conditions (ringworm) have recently come to my attention. I have tested both of them, and since they could prove useful in helping your cats to better health, I am following my usual practice and will give you a full report on them.

We all know that medical scientists are constantly on the search for new methods of combating sickness. They are turning up wonderful discoveries, but we still have a long hard road to travel before we can come close to finding the answers to all of the problems that are everlastingly confronting us in our attempts to bring good health to our cats. All of us must do all that we can to keep our cats healthy, and in so doing we are helping ourselves, too. Treating our cats with love and kindness, highly important as it is, is not sufficient; we must be constantly on guard against the many infections that can harass our loved pets. Always be on the alert, for it is much easier to cure any type of infection if it is detected early and medication instituted at once.

In *Tips to the Novice* in the March CATS, I discussed Cystitis in the Female Cat. The course of treatment recommended in that article is a very good one and in almost every case will help your cat if it has cystitis. I have, however, learned of another product, called *Furadantin*, which I have also found to be very helpful in the treatment of this common feline disorder. It is not a sulphonamide, nor is it an antibiotic, but it is described as an anti-bacterial agent suitable for the urinary tract. Its specific affinity for the urinary tract produces in the urine within minutes high anti-bacterial concentrations which continue for hours.

The manufacturers of Furadantin describe it as a wide spectrum antimicrobial agent that is bactericidal, relatively non-toxic, and which does not invoke resistant mutants. They say it is effective against a wide range of bacteria, including many species and organisms resistant to other agents, and that it is not harmful to kidneys, liver, and bloodforming organs. The first time we had occasion to use it, we found it very effective in ridding a cat of cystitis.

As I told you in the previous article, it is possible for cystitis to return if it has not been completely eradicated. When one of the females which we had treated as described in March had a relapse, we tried that complete method again, but at the conclusion results were not as they should

be, so we considered this a good time to test out the Furadantin and determine its possibilities for ourselves. Furadantin is made up in 50 mg. tablets, and these were broken in half with one half tablet being given three times a day until a total of fifteen tablets were administered. The condition cleared up very quickly. It has been quite some time now, with no indications of cystitis being evident. Her recovery has been so wonderful that she has been mated and the blessed event is due this month.

As I mentioned before, many different kinds of germs can cause cystitis. Evidently the Furadantin killed off the germs that the first formula had no effect upon. There are times when it takes more than one or two different medications to combat an infection, and in this case I believe both had their beneficial effect. It may be wise for you to follow the same pattern if the condition treated by either one of the methods does not clear up as it should.

Furadantin has been tried with much success in humans, and it is also being used as a remedy for dogs. We do not know if it has been tried on cats before but can truthfully say we believe it to be beneficial. Furadantin is manufactured by the Eaton Laboratories, Norwich, New York.

In February I discussed fungus conditions at some length. About the same time an article by Jacob Goser appeared in *All-Pets* concerning Dr. Frank Kral's use of iodine preparations in treating fungus. After reading that article I contacted the company who is manufacturing such products, and they obligingly sent me some samples to use. They are made by the West Laboratories, Inc., 42-16 West Street, Long Island City 1, New York, and come in two forms: Weladol Shampoo and Weladol Ointment—called "Tamed Iodine", by the manufacturer.

The Weladol Ointment is recommended for many skin conditions including common types of ringworm and fungus infection. According to instructions it is advisable to clip long hairs on and around affected areas. If possible, clip the entire body to reveal hidden lesions. Apply the Weladol Ointment by rubbing into affected areas of the skin and vicinity for two or three minutes once every other day for four to six applications. If necessary, repeat the applications after a fourteen day interval. As the final treatment use Weladol Shampoo according to directions to eliminate hair infection which may be a source of re-infection of the skin. The shampoo is also recommended for supportive treatment in the final stages of dermatitis or eczema, and for the removal of dandruff.

According to the instructions, you should use a double wash-up procedure over the entire skin surface. The second application is to be applied immediately after the first. Thoroughly wet the hair,

apply shampoo, develop a good lather, and rinse thoroughly. It is advisable to keep the shampoo out of the animal's eyes.

As you know, I have an aversion to iodine and in my estimation it is poisonous where cats are concerned. However, it appears that this form of iodine is harmless in the amounts used. When the Weladol Ointment and Shampoo were delivered to me I had dire misgivings because they are dark brown substances of the same color as iodine. I wondered what the result would be with my white cats. I knew of a friend's cat that was in a sorry shape because of fungus and it was this cat that we decided to try and help. Since the spots were very evident, it being a Domestic Shorthair, it was decided not to cut off the fur. The cat was bathed first in soap and water. After it dried the ointment was thoroughly rubbed into the skin. The next day the shampoo was used. The cat was again bathed and after rinsing the shampoo was applied. The cat was rubbed well all over, which was rather easy for the shampoo makes a fine lather. This was done for a period of five minutes. The cat was then dried after a water rinse. The next day the ointment was again used and followed again by the shampoo. This treatment was carried out for ten days. No new lesions developed and the cat was cured. The fur grew back in all affected spots, and the cat is now healthy and happy.

My next problem was to find out what effect the color would have upon my White Persians. I used it on one of my own cats, rubbing in some of the ointment and following this up with the shampoo. After it was all over and rinsed thoroughly I must say I was surprised. There was no trace of the brown color and if anything the fur was whiter than before treatment.

To find out if there would be any toxic effect I used the shampoo on a four-day-old kitten. The mother cat dried it off—after a rinsing, of course, but nothing happened to her. There we have it, four cats all different ages with no harm to any of them.

In using the lime-sulphur or the liver of sulphur treatment I believe the growth of the fur is hindered slightly. By this I mean the fur does not grow as thick for a while. I am anxious to see what the Weladol does in this respect. I now believe the Weladol treatment to be the best of the three. However, whatever you use there is one thing to remember. Begin treatment the minute you see signs of infection. If the fungus penetrates the inner layers of the skin it is much more difficult to cure. It is imperative that any treatment be started in the early stages and a cure will be realized with a minimum of effort on your part.

We know Federal Law restricts these drugs to sale by or on the order of a licensed veterinarian. This is as it should

be and you can obtain these products from your veterinarian. This poses a problem for there are a few veterinarians who may object to being notified of a treatment by a layman, but the great majority of the veterinarians will go along with you in an effort to help cure your cat. All I can do is advise you to go to your veterinarian and ask his advice. He may already know of these products and will oblige you by obtaining them for you.

Congratulations to all the winners of the All-Western and All-Midwestern Awards. Each cat is a beauty and I am sure the owners are very proud. It is a pleasure to see these healthy and beautiful cats win the coveted awards, for, it took their owners a great deal of effort to reach the top.

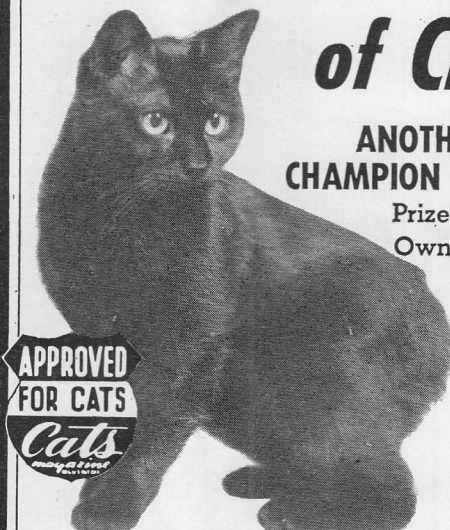

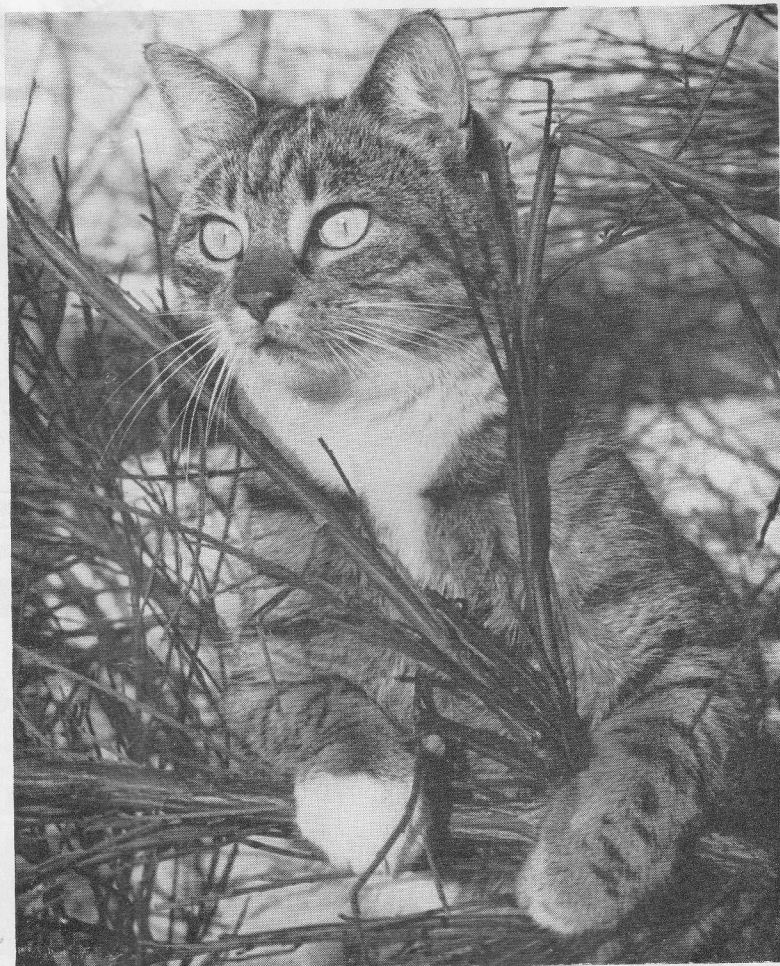

# NEW AND NON-FANCY IN GOTHAM

By Mallory Baele

There's a new kind of cat club in New York—a club devoted to the welfare of cats of all kinds. And though it is an entirely unaffiliated body, functioning strictly within the limits of the metropolitan New York area, its set-up is such that it may easily be duplicated by cat-conscious persons in any city or town with a large cat population.

Gotham Cat-Lovers is our club name, and at the beginning, the organizational momentum was supplied by the thousands of letters received by Miss Henrietta Hitchcock, conductor of the weekly column *Cats and Their Care* in the New York World Telegram & Sun. These requests from troubled readers asking information on the best way to care for their own beloved cats and deploring the plight of many strays to be found in the streets and back yards of the city and suburbs showed how great was the need for a strong organization to provide education and help to these and thousands of other cat-conscious individuals.

It was in an effort to provide a constructive solution to both sets of problems that Gotham Cat-Lovers was organized. Under the sponsorship of the Empire Cat Club of New York, but in no way officially connected with that group, we "amateurs" got under way at an organization meeting on March 15, 1956.

Our purposes are four-ply:

- 1) Education of members and public alike on proper care and treatment of cats of all kinds.
- 2) Placing of unwanted cats and kittens in good homes.
- 3) Systematic feeding of strays.
- 4) Provision of medical care, including castration and spaying at minimum cost for garnered strays who might otherwise spread disease to epidemic proportions and increase greatly the already tremendous cat population of our yards and alleys.

Although we have held only two meetings so far, we already have approximately 100 paid members on our rolls. (Dues are \$5.00 per year per person; \$7.50 per married couple.) At each meeting we plan to schedule a talk by an authority on cat problems. At our April 12th meeting, for instance, our members heard the well-known New York veterinarian, Dr. C. P. Zepp, discourse on cat diseases and their treatment, and at our May 10th meeting Dr. Lewis Tarr spoke on cat nutrition. Dr. Tarr is the proprietor of Pet Remedies, the unique pet drug store described in *CATS*, February 1955.

Temporary officers of our club have been largely drawn from the ranks of Empire, and they are providing experienced direction during our formative period. Our president is Mrs. Albert Alloy;

vice presidents are Mr. Morris L. Groder and Mr. Seymour Spruch. Head of our Program Committee is Mrs. Alice Buchanan, and in charge of our Placement Bureau is Mrs. Margaret E. Churan whose work was featured in the November 1955 *CATS*. Secretary-Treasurer is your correspondent. All work is, of course, on a voluntary basis.

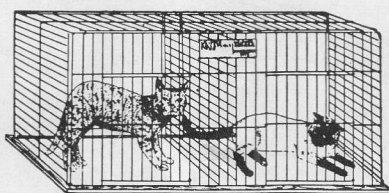

## Cats Question Box

Conducted By E. A. Renaux, D.V.M.

I have an eight year old female Persian who has had a fungus infection for about five years. Little scabby places occur on her skin which she bites and chews at. Many of these fall off and contain little tufts of hair. My veterinarian has treated her with Seleen and I have tried treatment with Cerbinol. She seems to get a little better but doesn't stay that way long. Could you offer any solution?

*The treatment that has been administered is very much in line with what I would suggest. You might try Desenex which has proven valuable against some of the fungus infections.*

We have observed our two-year-old female cat in mystifying performances. She will back up to a wall or shrub and go through the motions identical to those of a male cat "spraying." She has done this while in heat, while not in heat, while pregnant, and continues to do it now that her litter is ten days old. I would be interested in finding out why she does this.

## SINGAPORE STRAY

After forwarding our pair of Siamese from Japan to the States, my husband and I traveled from Tokyo through China, Siam, Ceylon, India, and Europe on our own way home. In Singapore, we stayed at a resort-type hotel about ten miles out of the city where we had a lovely suite on the beach, along the bay-front, with lattices instead of doors or windows and which we found more interesting than the modern air-conditioned rooms in spite of the heat and the bugs. Soon after we registered at this rather open-air inn, we heard the plaintive wail of a mother cat and caught sight of a couple of tiny kittens who disappeared as soon as we looked in their direction. As we had been traveling for over two weeks and were tired, we decided to have our dinner sent in for our first night and settled down for a quiet evening. When we turned out the lights we again heard a cat crying and, having just raised six kittens before leaving Tokyo, we couldn't stand it and went looking for the trouble. Imagine two Americans wandering around in their nightclothes in a native hotel after a crying cat!

Our dinner dishes were still on the table in the outer room and we poured the left-over cream into a saucer while calling the familiar "kitty, kitty." Suddenly the sweetest, but thinnest tabby we'd ever seen sprang out from under a lattice and devoured everything in sight. When she left after a little petting, we went back to bed. Several hours later I became aware of peculiar weights and noises on my bed and sat up to see what it was. To my horror, much scurrying was the result, and finally my husband discovered by looking under the sofa that "mamma" had brought at least six kittens to be fed too.

From what we had seen and heard that afternoon, we knew that the natives, who need food for themselves and their children, just aren't sympathetic to any animals and chase them away any time they come in sight. This was too much for us. We couldn't feed all the starving children in the Orient, nor all the starving kittens, but these kittens we knew about and every night, during our stay in Singapore, we had coffee brought in at midnight.

Our lovely visitor looked half-Siamese and half-Abyssinian, if you can picture it, and her temperament was just about that mixture too. She always came in first. Then, as soon as the cream was poured, she would run back under the lattice and call her family. We would shortly find seven or eight starving kittens lapping from our saucers. We are sure the servants didn't approve of it and have our doubts about their later treatment, but at least we did our part for a week. I'm not certain, but I think each saucer of cream cost us at least two dollars. Anyway, those nights in Singapore were most memorable. We wouldn't exchange them for any other high spots of our trip—JM

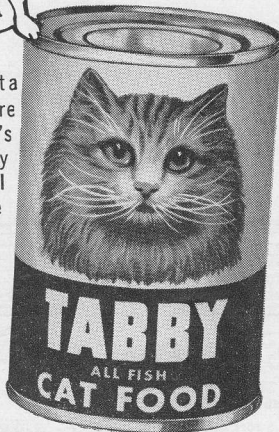

appalled to find the family cat eating the *pièce de résistance* before it was served. She quickly cut that section of the fish from the rest, and put both it and the cat outside. After her guests had dined and left, she grew frantic as she found her pet lying dead on the back porch. A call to the doctor resulted in her phoning the dinner guests and sending them in a mass rush to the hospital for ptomaine poisoning treatment.

Later in the evening when things had almost settled down to normal a neighbor came over to apologize for accidentally running over the cat, and not knowing what to do with it, leaving it on the porch until after her company had left.

The cats in Monaco could really create mass havoc should several be found dead, for, as Art Buchwald of the New York *Herald Tribune* writes, they live the life of Ranier—eating at the Casino. Every night they used to go behind the casino and dine on leftover caviar and such delicacies. They could watch the fireworks, attend all the functions—watch the personalities, and have the best time in the world.

Then it all changed. Mrs. Gerald Hale of Santa Barbara, California, decided the Casino life wasn't good for them. She bought land just outside the principality and built the swankiest cat resort in the entire world.

Mr. Buchwald reports that when he visited the shelter there were 123 cats enjoying the hot tinroofs, sleeping in special bunks and eating the cuisine that only French hotels can offer. There were trees for cats who liked to climb trees—specially built ladders for those who prefer the less primitive. The cats were divided into age groups, and there, too, if a cat wanted to mingle he could—if he felt like being alone, there was room for him to go into seclusion.

The day Mr. Buchwald was there the animals were served a luncheon of stew of caviar de russe, saumon fume, turtle soup, lobster a la newburg, roast duck with oranges, and asparagus—the dinner that cost \$12.00 the night before . . . people paying, that is.

The cats that choose to hang around the casino and live a wicked life can still do so, for residence at the shelter is voluntary. The only cats who can get in though, are stray cats found in Monaco. The only rule the shelter cats must follow that other cats may ignore is "NO KITTENS".

"Therefore, the choice of Monaco cats is, on one hand, a home with a beautiful view, excellent food, a place to play, and friends as against a back casino alley to sleep in, empty oyster shells to eat, and kittens. Each cat in Monaco must decide for himself."—J. L.

## The Back Fence . . .

There seems to be quite a bit of fireworks even in the world of felines here in these United States. Newspapers from all over the country carry items of debate in regards to the restriction of cats in various locales. A month or so ago, a suburb of Pittsburgh passed an ordinance confining cats to their owners' properties, and the local papers printed the pros and cons until it proved to be the usual tempest in the teapot sort of thing. (Indeed, your editors of CATS got in a few good licks.)

The Hackensack, New Jersey, *Bergen Record* reports a similar hassle when the Teaneck town council proposed a like ordinance. It drew a record crowd of cat-lovin' folks to the meeting and in the ensuing arguments, the council retreated and postponed any vote. Mr. Kendell, head of a cat society said, "Similar legislation has been tried in many cities and towns and has been defeated. In places where it has been adopted, it hasn't worked."

It presents a rather ludicrous picture—that of anyone trying to catch a cat who doesn't want to be caught. By the time anyone could summon sufficient equipment or help to secure friend cat, he would long since be home, curled up on the softest chair, licking the last trace of cream from his whiskers.

Must agree though, that a fight song—or the love call of some unhoused Tom ringing clear by dawn's early light cannot be classified with listening to Debussy's Clair de Lune as done by Rubinstein.

Kind of makes you wish that Maxwell Riddle, Pets Editor of the Cleveland, Ohio, *Press* would pass along his belief about cats to the cats themselves. He is certain that they use their tails in communicating. The tail swishing tells everyone the cat is displeased with events—but what does it mean when it twitches only the last inch or two? He watched his pet Chloe walk to the closet and pull open the door—her tail erect—just the end bent over. She was removed and the door again closed. Before deciding to reopen the door, she stood undecided. Her tail was at a 45-degree angle above her back, not stiff and gently switching.

He has noticed that there is a different angle when the food plate is full, and when, full of hope, she finds it empty. Is it disappointment? Chagrin? The equivalence of a shrug of the shoulders? Acceptance of the inevitable?

Certainly no creature is more philosophical—or more resourceful when confronted with challenging circumstances than the cat. The Bloomington, Indiana, *Herald-Telephone* had a delightful column on the frustration of a mere man trying to cope with the esprit of his two birthday presents, to wit: a pedigreed White Longhair named Fluffy and his partner in crime, Fumiko, the Siamese.

A skillfully executed plan to keep these

two off the kitchen table via the mild hotfoot, collapsed when Mrs. Lefferson, wife, but not electrically minded, connected the wires incorrectly and the aluminum foil atop the wires, instead of getting warm, scorched the table top and ruined the transformer. Mr. Lefferson said it didn't work anyway for the kits soon learned a humming noise meant the transformer was working and the table was "off limits." So, they are now using the table again as an operation base.

Mr. Boyce, of Allegan, Michigan, tried breaking him of it by swatting him lightly with a newspaper. Then, a tornado hit Allegan and the Boyce home was destroyed and so, apparently, was Tinker. The Boyce family found refuge with neighbors and the lost Tinker one day turned up at the house, but it was noticed that he wouldn't go near a bed—nor Mr. Boyce.

"I guess he was sound asleep on the bed when the tornado hit," said Mr. Boyce. "I'm still trying to convince him that it wasn't I who delivered that giant swat."

I hope he gets home safely and I suggest you have a veterinarian look at him. His jaw is sore and he has not eaten very much."

The Greggs' veterinarian's diagnosis was a concussion and internal injuries but that Diablo would pull through.
